OUR CHURCH IS OPEN DURING DAYLIGHT HOURS





This is Peace Sunday and so we pray for the gift of peace within our world and ask that God grant us the grace to be peacemakers in our families and community.

In only three weeks time we will be visited by our Archbishop - John Wilson - of Southwark who will celebrate Mass for us. It is an occasion that we anticipate with great joy and it is timely therefore to consider the role of the bishop in the family of the Church. It is very fashionable nowadays - as Elton John once said - to not be a fan of "organised religion". Given the current news stories about Downing Street parties during lockdown there is also a climate of resentment towards figures of authority - those who are in charge - and this can beget a cynicism and scepticism about authority and leadership in general. Jesus had to remind St Peter - whom He would entrust with great authority - that he was a weak sinner like all of us. His vocation was to lead God's people by imitating His Lord - whom the Second Vatican Council teaches us - is the true Head (the true leader) of the Church. Peter was afraid and reluctant to share in His work at first yet - finally - said "yes" to God's will. His will was to appoint Bishops because He knows we need good leaders - good shepherds - back then and still today. May He help Archbishop John to be holy and lead us by good example.

SYNOD 2023: The parish listening phase of the Synod is almost at an end. Our synod delegates - Katie Donkor and Edward Parry - have chaired meetings in-person and online and are now beginning to prepare our parish submission. At these meetings - and after Masses - feedback forms were made available for us by our housebound parishioners. ALTAR SERVERS’ REHEARSAL: *A reminder to all parents*: if your child wishes to serve at the altar they must attend our Altar Servers’ Rehearsals.
