We pray for Joscelyn Ferdinand Haughton-James who died recently and for all whose anniversaries occur at this time. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. We remember all who are working at our hospitals at the current time; doctors, nurses, medical staff, porters, administrators, cooks, cleaners. We pray for the London Ambulance service staff, those who work administering emergency response via phone and those working in the air to come to the aid of those who are seriously unwell. May each individual who is working to save lives be given the graces of perseverance.

I celebrated the funeral Mass of Alfred Owusu today whom many of our Ghanaian community knew and will miss. Within what was a warm and succinct appreciation of his life it was mentioned - with great thanks - that he produced translations of the Ghanaian liturgical music for parishioners here: he helped others to understand and appreciate words of prayer directed to God. Our listening to words of prayer sung is something we miss at the moment owing to the restrictions we are employing in Church. It was so sad that - for someone dedicated to song himself (he used to sing the Reproaches in our parish during the Good Friday liturgy) - there could be no singing at his funeral Mass. Instead we listened to the hymns being played (very well) on a keyboard and I asked that we sing inside ourselves: look at the words on the page, internalise them and express them in our hearts without our voices. It's a strange sensation - alien to the ordinary experience of Mass (as so many things are at the moment) but it was also powerful. There was a sense - even though we were silent - of deep prayer and participation. It was a lesson not merely learned but lived in the Mass of the value of being still which leads to contemplation: it makes us aware of our internal life and our desire for God.


