May the souls of all the faithful departed - through the mercy of God - rest in peace!

This is a rare Sunday on which the feast of the Presentation of the Lord Jesus is celebrated. The feast is always on the 2nd February because it is 40 days after the birth of Jesus when families would visit Jerusalem with their new-born children for the ritual of purification. We experience a beautiful break from the norm in our liturgy too as the candles of the Church are blessed and we are reminded of the important symbol of light - of flame; of fire - within our Christian faith. This symbol is highlighted at a time when - in our readings - we will hear of Simeon who (after encountering Jesus) says that he has seen the salvation prepared for all nations. Simeon waited for this day above all and it was the encounter with Jesus that led to him rejoicing at having seen; gained insight and been enlightened. We are used to hearing the word "enlightenment" to describe secular philosophies and the bringing to birth of changes within society in recent centuries. Discussions continue about the consequences of these ideas and the degree to which they have been beneficial or detrimental. In Simeon, however, we see not a philosopher but a saint who is an example to us because he recognised that Jesus brings authentic enlightenment more than any other person, theory or system. It is only through our communion with Jesus: our speaking to Him and offering ourselves to Him, that we come to see (as our creator intended) in this life. We are brought to look upon what is most important and seek it: His presence in others and His example of the willingness to suffer out of love. When we lose sight of Him we are less and so we are each called to learn from Simeon today: to spend our lives longing to see the Messiah and not let our other concerns get in the way of this - our life's purpose - to be with Our Lord Jesus Christ.
