
I attended the event for young adults at St George's Cathedral last Thursday evening and returned inspired. Over 300 Catholics aged 16-35 came to learn more about Carlo Acutis - the London-born young man who is to be declared a saint by Pope Leo in September - and spend time in prayer. Fr Mebrate and I heard confessions non-stop for a few hours and Fr Mebrate held a relic of St Carlo at the sanctuary while all the young people processed forward to venerate it. We were taught - very simply and beautifully - about the Church's tradition of venerating relics which is important in an age that very often doesn't understand the practice. The relics of the saints are an essential part of Catholic tradition: whenever a Church is consecrated a relic is inserted into the altar and this is the reason why the priest kisses the altar to venerate the earthly remnant of a holy person in heaven. When we venerate we do not worship - we only worship God - and so this practice is not idolatrous: it is an act of devotion that leads us to seek the intercession of the saint whom we revere and to be inspired and led by their holy life to change our behaviour in order to become holy as they were holy. I was impressed by the large crowd of young people who came - from all across the city - to be close to St Carlo and (as I watched them give up their Thursday evening to stand in line and wait in order to be close to the earthly remains of a saint) I saw the power of the saints for us. St Carlo was devoted to the Eucharist and produced a website detailing all the Eucharistic miracles around the world. One of his relatives - who knew Carlo and spoke to us about him - was asked what impressed her most about him and she said that although young he was a great teacher of the faith. He taught about the power of the Eucharist in the Mass and Adoration. As those young people knelt to adore the Lord in Adoration it was clear that St Carlo's teaching career hasn't ended but he still continues to inspire us. St Carlo Acutis, pray for us!

PARISH NEWS

A TERRIFYINGLY DARK WEEK IN BRITISH HISTORY: These were the words of our Archbishop describing the votes in parliament to legalise abortion up to the moment of birth and remove protections from the elderly and vulnerable just over a week ago. The former was an amendment to the Government's Policing and Crime Bill which merited 46 minutes of debate without public consultation or evidence sessions. The amendment may return to the commons for a vote and it is, therefore, essential to contact your MP about this matter. You can do so via www.righttolife.org.uk or by clicking here. The vote on Assisted Suicide was passed by a significantly reduced margin - only 23 votes: see Right To Life site or click here. Archbishop John's statement can be read by clicking here.

ART EXHIBITION BY CHRIS CHRISTODOULOU: NEXT WEEKEND - on 5th & 6th July - our Hall will host a display of 'Odyssey' themed around personal narratives, dreams and memories. Chris will also display his personal interpretation of the Stations of the Cross in print. From 11am on both days parishioners are welcome to see the works and the exhibit is open to the public from 2pm.

SAFEGUARDING CONSULTATION: The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) - the body that maintains good practice within the Church on this issue - is beginning a new inspection cycle with our Archdiocese of Southwark. They are calling on anyone - whatever their role - to share their experience of safeguarding in the Archdiocese and are particularly interested in hearing from anyone who has experienced abuse. SPONSOR A SHRUB: Back in March I consulted re plans for our garden and you'll notice that we've now removed the shrubbery around the entrance. A kind landscape-gardener-parishioner is preparing a list of shrubs you will be able to sponsor that are lower lying so as to allow the light to come into our porch area and not encroach on the pathway. Shrubs will also be listed for our front garden of a similar nature at the base of the East wall of the Church and (once cleared) at the back of the Hall toilets.

We will make the Sunday special with coffee and cake after the 10am Mass and then light lunch after the 12pm Mass.
