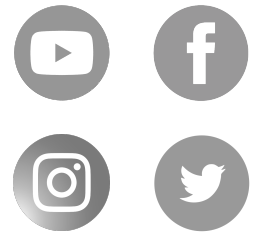

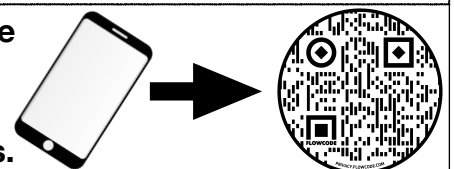

**THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY** is this coming Wednesday and there will be two Masses (at 11am and 7:30pm) in the parish as we remember the visit of the Kings and the revelation of God to the whole world. Do join us for our celebration (there is no need to book in advance)! The evening Mass of the Epiphany will be live-streamed so all those who are at home can join in our celebration.

**MASS AND CONFESSIONS:** Our Weekday Mass will return to the normal time of 9:30am from this Thursday (the morning after the Epiphany) preceded by our Holy Hour at 8:30am. Confessions will be heard on Saturdays from 5-6pm (socially distanced in the Hall) from Saturday 2nd January.
