We pray for those who work in national and local government attempting to meet the needs of the vulnerable. We remember those who work in production, cargo and transportation bringing much needed equipment to those on the front line. We also remember all who are struggling due to a loss of income and all whose businesses are adversely affected by this crisis.

Isolation is weird and we don't like it! After the novelty of Joe Wicks' workouts wears off we begin to realise that we weren't created for this! Whatsapp-ing, Zoom-ing, House Party-ing makes us realise we're not *really* in touch: we are body and soul for a reason: to experience *communion* which is *un*-pixellated, *un*-interrupted by technology. And the explanation of this truth about our need and the ultimate answer to it is what we're about to witness (to *celebrate*) as Holy Week begins today. It genuinely pains me that for the first time as your priest I'll be unable to share these greatest feasts of our year with you all in person! These days contain some of the most moving readings in our Lectionary; the moments when we're helped to realise that "God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son." (John 3:16). He comes to us in the flesh to be with us *in the flesh*; His texts (the Law) and His calls (the Prophets) He knows to be inadequate. They anticipate His *coming to us in His Body and Blood*; the most intimate union for which we give thanks on Maundy Thursday in our Mass of the Lord's Supper, on Good Friday in the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion and on Easter Sunday as we remember His Body (the Eucharist) is eternal. He is *always* with us in every Mass. As we experience His physical absence at this time may it increase our hunger for His presence. Let this be our prayer! **Fr M.**

Fr Gerard Balinnya: We all experienced symptoms in The Priests' House, however, Fr Gerard's symptoms worsened to such an extent that an ambulance had to be called last Tuesday. He was admitted to King's College Hospital where he is currently. He was diagnosed with COVID-19 and X-ray showed the presence of pneumonia in his lungs. His next of kin here in the UK and his family in Uganda are aware of his condition and location as is the Archbishop, Area Bishop and Chaplain at the hospital. Please remember Fr Gerard in your prayers at this time as he struggles to rid himself of the symptoms of this awful virus which has truly taken its toll upon him.

Helping the needy: We have been working hard to ensure that everyone who is in a vulnerable position; either alone or lacking support from others who can shop for them, are being helped. In doing this I've liaised with Lambeth Council who have great services for the vulnerable. If you know of anyone who requires basic assistance to prevent them leaving the house please get in touch with us and we either help them directly or sign-post them. Telephone support: The clergy and the SVP have been calling those who are isolated and lack the support of friends and family. Although we're currently unable to visit nursing homes due to infection control we've been in touch with the Manager of Windmill Lodge Nursing Home who is arranging for us to video call residents to maintain spiritual support for them while in isolation.
