We pray for Jesus Miguel Torre who died recently and for Otis John Bellamy who is unwell. We pray for the repose of the souls of Alice Joan Webber, Dorothy Northey, Igbo Ojaruega, Lawrence Sweeney, Vanda Haughton James and Rosemary Kavanagh and all those whose anniversaries occur at this time. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. As the economic implications of the pandemic begin to be felt more acutely in the lives of so many we pray for those who are facing the frustration and humiliation of not being able to afford the basic necessities of life. We pray for those who work in food banks across the country helping those they would never expect to see.

We will celebrate the feast day of St Frances Xavier Cabrini this coming week who was an inspiring woman whose faith in Jesus Christ, despite the adversity of her health problems, led her to become "Mother Cabrini" to so many children. She educated the children of Italian immigrants to New York and provided for the needs of many orphans at the end of the 19th Century in the USA. She did this so effectively she was invited all over Europe making 23 trans-Atlantic crossings to ultimately help establish 67 institutions including schools, hospitals and orphanages. She originally intended and desired that she and her sisters would minister in China and, having approached the Holy Father about this, was told "go not to the East, but to the West." She did not want to do this; it wasn't part of her plans and ambitions yet she humbly allowed herself to be led in the opposite direction of where she expected to go trusting in the power of God to use her wherever He placed her. This is a time of plans and expectations being changed for so many because of the wretched economic consequences of the pandemic which, I know, many of you are experiencing. I hear of people applying for jobs they never thought of applying for in their lives before: they are being led down unfamiliar paths into unfamiliar territory which is perplexing and worrying. Journeying into the chaos and poverty of New York of her time would have been so too for St Frances. May she be your intercessor to help you who struggle in this way at this time.


