

This undoubtedly has its challenges which I discussed with several of the sisters at a recent BBQ at which we said goodbye to Sister Yanina. Yet, alongside the sadness of saying goodbye - a sadness St Paul records himself experiencing on his missionary journeys - is trust that the Lord is leading us whenever we follow him. This is true for Sr Yanina, all the sisters of our parish and every single one of us too.
