We pray for all working in our Universities to ensure that students get the most out of their experience; lecturers and staff in their halls of residence. We pray that the isolation experienced by so many does not leave them feeling alone and vulnerable and that the Lord Jesus will make his presence felt to those who are disappointed at this time.

I'm very grateful to our musicians and singers for returning at once (when it became possible) to sing at our 10am Mass. Music has the ability to transport us from the earthly to the heavenly realm and, this being the case, it is sad that we are unable to join in (there has been no congregational singing in Churches for half a year)! Our country has a rich tradition of choral music and hymnody and, as I look to the feasts of the coming week, I'm reminded of the hymn "O Sacred Heart". St Margaret Mary Alacoque, whose presence in heaven we will celebrate this coming Friday, is responsible for devotion to the heart of Jesus becoming mainstream. At first sight (like many devotions) it may seem a bit strange and potentially off-putting but this hymn reminds us of the consoling nature of all devotion; its effect of creating within us a remembrance of Jesus' love for us sinners. The heart is possibly the greatest metaphor for love (nowadays people make the shape of one with their hands to express it) and the devotion exists to remind us of his heart so that we may be more and more trusting each day in His love. Many are in need of consolation while in isolation at this time and the current pandemic has been a harsh reminder that none of us are self-sufficient. In these times many would be grateful hearing the words of the hymn, set to song so beautifully <u>here</u>: "O Sacred Heart, our trust is all in thee, for though earth's night be dark and drear, thou breathest rest where thou art near, O Sacred Heart!" **Fr M**.
