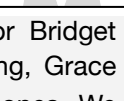

Rita was a great advocate for the sanctity of life and the dignity of the unborn child. She was an ardent supporter of most socials within the parish. A highly independent lady who in latter years worked together with a group of faithful parishioners who stayed close to her as her health deteriorated. Rita valued their company and generosity of spirit which they offered right up to her going into a home and the lock down. May she rest in peace.

Fr Gerard Balinnya: Fr Gerard has been very touched and moved by those of you who have said that you are praying for him in hospital. I passed on these messages to him. He joined us online for our celebration of Maundy Thursday and was very encouraged to know of us praying for him. I have just received news that Fr Gerard is to be discharged from hospital. The situation is unclear as to where Fr Gerard will go at the current time and I am liaising with the diocesan welfare officer and the Bishop about where he is to reside. Let's continue to keep him very much in our prayers and thank God for the news that he is no longer in need of hospital care.

We are now streaming in HD with professional audio and stream a daily Holy Hour at 08:30 (Monday to Friday) which includes the Rosary at 09:10. Our daily Mass is 10am but there will be no Holy Hour & Rosary on Easter Monday (13th) and Tuesday (14th).

Helping the needy: We have been working hard to ensure that everyone who is in a vulnerable position; either alone or lacking support from others who can shop for them, are being helped. In doing this I've liaised with Lambeth Council who have great services for the vulnerable. If you know of anyone who requires basic assistance to prevent them leaving the house please get in touch with us and we either help them directly or sign-post them. Telephone support: The clergy and the SVP have been calling those who are isolated and lack the support of friends and family. Although we're currently unable to visit nursing homes due to infection control we've been in touch with the Manager of Windmill Lodge Nursing Home who is arranging for us to video call residents to maintain spiritual support for them while in isolation.

The Food Bank: The Food Bank have written to me to thank all of you who have been so generous in donating food items. Its centres are closed for visit (there is one drop-off) point. They still need cash donations (click [here](#)) and also long-life milk and new Bags for Life.
