We pray for the staff and pupils of our school and all parishioners who have been affected; those unable to work, those in financial difficulty and those experiencing loneliness at this time.

Coronavirus & The Cross: It is good to be in touch! I know it means reading this from your home instead of in Church and it is so bizarre for us to be without you. We are in times of great distress for so many and it is easy to become overwhelmed and lose sight of God. This is why Archbishop John has encouraged each of us to create a shrine in our homes and to turn to the Lord frequently. Our parish Church (our common home) is open from 08:30 - 6pm each day and in the Church we have erected a public shrine. Since there is no communal celebration of Mass the forward altar has been moved and in its place is the Crucifix surrounded by two candles which burn throughout the day. This is the usual scene on Good Friday after the 3pm service; it is a stark reminder to us of Him whose act of perfect love is the central subject of our faith; "Jesus Christ who was crucified" (1Cor 2:2) Whenever we suffer we turn to Him who suffered for us and who suffers with us. In moments such as these let us make His cross the focus of our prayer. On the cross He reminds us that He endured and overcame darkness out of love for us. When we suffer we share in what He experienced and we believe that by uniting our sufferings to His He will give us strength to endure and find new life!

We will add them to our mailing list so we can all stay in touch.

The Food Hub: People have made enquiries about continuing to donate items to the Food Bank. The Food Bank is still open and receiving donations; visit the link by clicking <u>here</u> to know what is required. Donations of food can be left in the Church in the basket to the right of Our Lady's altar. If others are in the Church please remember to observe social distancing; we are to be six feet apart to prevent the potential spread of infection. All those with serious medical conditions should be self-isolating. They (and all those self-isolating) can give financial support by clicking <u>here</u>.

Welcome Deacon Dermott! St John's Seminary in Wonersh is where those who are training to become priests in our Archdiocese receive formation and instruction. In light of COVID19 the seminary has shut and all seminarians have been transferred to parishes to assist. Fr Gerard and I have therefore been joined by my brother Dermott who is a Deacon and able to assist with the initiatives we are getting off the ground to keep us in touch with God & one another. Welcome bro'!

Funeral of Archbishop Emeritus of Southwark Peter Smith RIP: Archbishop John Wilson writes: "There will now be a private Reception of the Body and Funeral Liturgy, with burial in the Cathedral vault. At a later date, when the restrictions have been removed, a Mass in memoriam will be celebrated where we can all gather together. Please continue to pray for the repose of his soul."

Our Church remains open for private prayer daily from 08:30 - 6pm. All are welcome to find solace in the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle, to light a candle and say their prayers.
