We pray for George Rampersaud whose funeral was on Friday & all those who have died recently. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. We pray for Françoise Atta who is unwell and remember all who are sick at this time. We pray for those in the developing world who are working to secure vaccines for their populations. May they be assisted by the generosity of other nations with more resources to ensure that they receive adequate protection as quickly as possible so they can grow.

One of the many blessings of spending seven years studying in Italy was the language course in Tuscany and living in the small town of San Giovanni Valdarno (near to Arezzo). It was there I first encountered the works of Fra Angelico (c.1395: the Dominican friar beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1982). He is most famous for the frescoes he painted on the walls of the Dominican friary in Florence, however, it was his altar piece of The Annunciation that is most proudly held by the small town of San Giovanni Valdarno: painstakingly preserved in the town’s small museum, it is a simply beautiful image of the moment the angel Gabriel announced that the virgin would conceive. This coming Thursday we keep the wonderful feast - nine months before Christmas Day - of the moment Jesus Christ began to exist in time in Our Lady’s womb. The celebration reminds us of the importance of the moment of conception: a sacred moment indicated by Fra Angelico’s choice to display the Holy Spirit (in the form of a dove) radiating upon the womb of the virgin Mary. We can easily romanticise the Annunciation and fail to consider the enormity of what Mary was being asked to do and the great responsibility being entrusted to her. Fra Angelico captured the tension by revealing Gabriel as both beautiful but imposing: Our Lady’s reaction is one of acceptance yet reservation. Let us pray for all who - like Our Lady - face crisis pregnancy and pray that we may build a culture which cares for all mothers in difficulty and their unborn children.


