We pray for Joscelyn Ferdinand Haughton-James who died recently and for all whose anniversaries occur at this time. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. We pray for all who are working to ensure that the vaccination programme runs smoothly; for those administering the vaccine, those training them, those in charge of logistics and those transporting the supplies. We also pray for all who may feel exhausted and under pressure: may they be helped to go on.

Have you heard of St Angela Merici? Maybe your answer is “no”. Have you heard of the Ursuline Convent Girls’ School? I’d imagine your answer is “yes”: there’s one in Brentwood and (closer to home) in Wimbledon. St Angela’s passion for educating girls in the Catholic faith was noticed around the time of the Counter-Reformation and the zeal of her twelve sisters whom she chose to fulfil her noble ambition, kept many within the family of the Church at a time when apostasy was commonplace. What was the key to her success? I’m keen on reading biographies and I think the popularity of this type of literature is that we’re curious about people who’ve succeeded. How did they do it? What am I doing wrong and how can I be more successful? If we were to apply these questions to the life of St Angela we learn something surprising and inspiring. Her choice of a patron saint for her Order (St Ursula) and her choice to be buried in the habit of St Francis of Assisi reveals a great devotion to the saints. She sincerely believed that - before her own efforts - the prayers of the saints and the power of God is that which brings about success or fruitfulness: leads souls to Christ. May the example of her faith - which was the engine of her charity - inspire all who find it a struggle to teach at this time.




CARDINAL NICHOLS ON RECEIVING THE VACCINE: The Archbishop of Westminster, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, [tweeted yesterday](#) a selfie of him receiving the COVID Vaccine. He reminded all of the importance of our getting vaccinated in order to protect not only ourselves but those around us. I'm pleased to hear from many in our 80+ group of parishioners the good news that they have received their second dose! It's a great testament to the industriousness of our health care workers; doctors and nurses in the local area, that so many have been vaccinated. Statistics reveal a significant number of individuals who are reluctant to be vaccinated. It is important to remind ourselves that there are **no ethical problems** with taking the vaccine and that - in choosing to do so - we are loving ourselves and our neighbour. I do hope you'll all be called to receive yours soon!
