A man was visiting his dying father and saying goodbye. The father gave him a package and explained that this was all he had. It contained a dirty metallic bowl. The boy later fell on hard times and so used the pot to beg for money in the street. One day a passerby put a coin in, and it made a ringing noise. The passerby was a jeweller so inspected the bowl and asked the boy why he was begging as the bowl is worth over £30,000. This is a good analogy for the Holy Spirit as we often forget to ask for His powerful help. Confirmation candidates sometimes remark that they don’t feel different after receiving the sacrament. The Holy Spirit is not magic, will not solve all our problems nor make us wealthy and successful. We won’t feel a spiritual high. But, the Spirit will give us gifts to become more conformed to Christ, so as to serve our neighbour, if we ask. Pope Francis said, the Holy Spirit will “bring peace where there is discord, concord where there is conflict... respond to arrogance with meekness, malice with goodness, shouting with silence, gossip with prayer, defeatism with encouragement.” Let us pray for this: O, Holy Spirit, soul of my soul, I adore you. Enlighten, guide, strengthen and console me. Tell me what I ought to do and command me to do it. I promise to submit to everything that you permit to happen to me. Deacon Dermott writes... Many of you will have heard that Fr Matthew was assaulted early on Bank Holiday Monday when he went for a run. He was tying his shoelace after tripping up when a lady ran up to him and hit him with a beer can, subsequently assaulting two police officers and vandalising a police van. The wound to his head became infected so he went into hospital for a couple of days but is now back in the Priests' house recuperating and gradually improving. He is very grateful for all the messages of concern, support and for your prayers. Please also pray for perpetrator that she will get the help and support she clearly needs.

Due to the above, we will not be able to stream our Mass and Holy Hour until **Wednesday 3rd June**, subject to Fr Matthew's recovery. Pentecost is the birthday of the Church and is a reminder that as Catholics we have an essential link with Archbishop John who is a successor of the Apostles in the upper room.
