Where Do Your Ad Valorem Taxes Go?

Your property taxes help fund the essential services provided by the City. In the most recent budget, the General Fund will collect \$1,865,588.19 in revenues, most of which comes from ad valorem (property) taxes.

Here's how those funds will be spent:

In Summary:

Over half of your property tax dollars (53%) go directly to public safety—police and fire protection. The rest supports streets, parks, city administration, courts, code enforcement, animal control and more—everything that helps the city run smoothly and serve residents.
