

### **In The Works**

We've been busy lately getting new music ready for our catalogue. At the moment, work continues on <u>Gustavo Delgado</u> <u>Parra</u>'s brilliant **Ecos de Alejandria**.

This stunning piece, a concerto for five organs, is expressive, virtuosic, and profoundly moving. Scored for the eclectic instruments in the Nave of San Agustín in Mexico City (Polanco), the composer deftly makes use of the tonal resources of each instrument at hand. The five players, seated at keydesks in galleries and mezzanines high above the nave floor, engage in grand dialogues for hands and feet.

A most compelling piece, made all the more dramatic as performed in a splendid 6 second acoustic that envelopes the space in glorious sound.

Release of this work, complete with alternative performance suggestions is anticipated for Spring 2025.

Frederick Frahm's cycle for organ **Ezra** is a 60" concert work in 15 movements. Based on selections from A. R. Ammons' cycle of poems entitled Ommateum (1955), the work follows Ezra, the poet's nomadic main character who moves through time and place, life and death, in a journey that unfolds unbound by time or embodiment.
