On December 23, Emmanuel Manana, director of our DORCAS project in Uganda, wrote:

"Today was a wonderful day!" It was the day of the long awaited Christmas party, an annual event for the village children that Shared Blessings has sponsored for the past 26 years. It is an all day affair with plenty of good food, rare treats (like cake), games, dancing and vigorous singing. The 13 sponsored children, all HIV positive, took part in the fun. Added to their joy was their Christmas gift, \$25 per child, to spend whatever way they wished. The most popular choice as always was Christmas clothes.
