# Commemorating the day of the African Child.

On warm Monday morning of 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2022, children from over (8) eight schools gathered at SLU premises in Makukuba to participate in the celebrations to commemorate the International Day of the African Child.

The event that was organized Shared Love Uganda in partnership with Child Care Uganda, rotated on the theme: "*ELIMINATING HARFUL PRACTICES AFFECTING CHILDREN*"



Over 800 children in the accompaniment of their teachers took to the murrum roads of Makukuba Community while matching at the tune of the band while flashing banners and placards carrying the child rights advocating messages fitting within the theme and meaning of the day.



**The International AIDS day** was also commemorated with a number of activities including free HIV testing and counseling, sensitization among others. Under the themes "Ending inequalities among adolescent girls, young women and boys," and "Equalize" close to 500 people were tested and helped know their status.

#### The Health Centre is steadily progressing

Over 3000 clients have been treated, counseled and reached out through the health center and community outreaches programs.



Medical camps and Community Based Health Care Services

We successfully held two medical camps where close to 1350 people received services in general medicine, ophthalmic, covid19 and HPV vaccination, health talks, circumcision and others.



Through the weekly a community outreach program, we have been able to reach more than 648 people who are unable to come at the health Centre and while offering free medical support, we have also held sensitizations in sanitation and other preventive measures of diseases



Approximately 1,580 patients from OPD and 976 from IPD have been attended at the facilities and many others reached out from the community.



We have managed to immunize over 500 children and some adults, these include children of 0-5 years who are immunized against the killer diseases, children of 10 years who are immunized against HPV virus, adults of 18 years and above who are immunized against hepatitis B and covid 19.



Generally, we have been able to attend to 150 maternity cases at the maternal clinic.

In the spiritual department, we have strengthened the work of building as strong God fearing society through spiritual activities among the children, youth and community members.



We have conduct several open air evangelism while preaching, teaching and giving testimonies about Jesus Christ

With the support from our friends from US, we have been able to gradually improve the church structure

Evangelizing in churches, schools and communities has been greatly done throughout the year. Attendance has increased in churches and in fellowships and we are planning to enlarge the building with the church help from the members and community at large. We also had over 800 people attend a open air crusades in organized in Makukuba.







We have held a number of bible classes within the schools and community.

#### Community Development Outreach

While accelerating community access to safe and clean water, we have managed to maintain and repair 7 old boreholes in Makukuba, Kizima, Gonve, Kaabulo and Kawoomya. In partnership with SUUBI communi1 new borehole has been put in place for Nabbaale 2 which will serve the neighboring schools and community members.



Through the seed capital community empowerment project, more than 60 members from 7 Self Help Groups (SHGs) have accessed loan advances to boost their personal and group development projects. And at least 12 members have engaged themselves into poultry, 13 in piggery, and 15 in small shops within the community. These continue to earn some money through sales and improve on family incomes thereby increasing savings in groups.



In the pictures are the SHG members during their weekly meetings and on the right is the poultry project established by one of the SHG members after accessing seed capital.

**Functional Adult Learners FAL** classes have been successful in Makukuba. We have been able to have Functional Adult Learning Classes with a population of more than 30 ladies from Makukuba parish. The eager leaners were taken through basic mathematic, English language and entrepreneurship.

At the end of the year, at least 30 were bale to graduate and handed completion certificates at during the occasion that was graced by the sitting president of Rotary Club of Lubaga.



# Visitors

During the year, the Rotary Club of Kasangati committed a full day at SLU while participating in the health camp, where more than 1,000 community members benefited.





It was also a mind blowing experience for the children at Shared Love Junior school when HARRIS International donated and delivered more than 300 pairs of school shoes.

We were privileged to have a team led by Kevin visit us in Makukuba. During their stay, they were bale to visit the sponsored children in their homes, besides spending precious time with children at the school



Soon after Kevin and his team had left, another team of US visitors led by Aunt Suzan also landed and spent quality time with the children at the vocational institute, the Junior school and in the community.





Towards the end of May, 2022, SLU was blessed with a visit of the Bishop of Mukono diocese the Right. Rev. James William Ssebaggala. Who toured around SLU projects and planted a memorial tree.



It was also another exciting moment when Harald from Child care paid a visit to SLU. During his short stay, he visited SLU junior school and donated a number of goodies to the children.

# New Project Developments

With support from Shared Love Uganda and our friends in US, we have managed to have a number new structures constructed and completed these include the class room block that hosts tailoring and hairdressing, the girls and boy's dormitories with insides bathroom among

The boys and girls' dormitories were completed and are already in use since November, 2022. with the two dormitories at the girl's wing, the females from the Junior school have occupied one block and the vocational students who see to be mature are occupying another block. The Boy's dormitories which is bigger in side and spaces has been partitioned to accommodate males from the Junior school on one sides and males from the vocational school on the other.

# Meetings and workshops

We have conducted a number of workshops with child protection committees and several meetings with parents of both sponsored and non-sponsored children under SLU program.





Workshops and meetings among the leadership, the staff and management have been also conducted to discuss the future of SLU.
