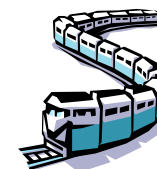

**Themed Enrichment Programs** Context-centered learning, including pursuit of individual interests, occur through exploration and sharing activities. Badges are earned daily in recognition of skills applied during these activities such as participating, listening, being creative, asking questions, being helpful, etc. Families are always welcome to visit! Please note, schedules are subject to change. They may need to be adjusted due to inclement weather, etcetera.

#### June 4 to June 29

**Week 1 Design a Garden** Learn about foods produced locally and how to construct and manage a garden. Select foods to plant and take a field trip to a garden supply store on the afternoon of 6/5 or 6/6.

**Week 2 Wheels for Fun!** Work together to design courses for bicycles, scooters, and toy cars or trucks. The goal is to produce a field day for all the participants on the afternoon of 6/14 or 6/15.

**Week 3 Rocks and Caves** Learn about types of rocks, build collections, and create rock art. Open and investigate geodes and other special formations such as stalactites and stalagmites that occur in caves. We will take a field trip to a cave on the afternoon of 6/20 or 6/21.

**Week 4 Tournament of Games** Individually or with a partner design a game to be played outside. Include a scoring system and a board on which to show the points. All will play in a tournament on 6/28 and 6/29. We will swim 6/26 afternoon at City pool.

#### July 9 to Aug. 3

**Week 1 Animals & Farming** Identify animals raised on Missouri farms. Choose a favorite and learn how farmers care for them and manage them today. A field trip to Purina Farms or a local farm will be scheduled on 7/10 or 7/12.

**Week 2 Scavenger Hunts** With a partner or in small groups, design a scavenger hunt that can be completed within a couple of days. There will be guidelines to follow for creating the hunts, and a walking field trip will occur on 7/19 to help teams collect items. Ice cream prizes will be awarded to the members of teams who complete their project.

**Week 3 Movies Week** Movies that are content and age appropriate and popcorn will be available in the downstairs waiting room and the upstairs classroom. Individuals may bring a pillow and something to make the floor more comfortable. There will also be a swim afternoon at the City Park's pool on 7/25.

**Week 4 Harvest Garden** Celebrate the success of the garden with a summer foods picnic and games on 8/2 or 8/3. We will swim 7/31 afternoon at the City Park's pool.
