



Guide to Vehicle Classification for WMMC Car Shows

The WMMC spring and fall car shows provide numerous classifications of vehicles eligible for awards, with divisions for the type and year of the vehicle. In addition, vehicles are classified by the degree to which they have been modified. The definitions of Stock, Modified and Special Interest vehicles are provided below to ensure your vehicle is properly classified for our shows.

Stock Vehicle Class

A stock vehicle may have limited modifications beyond those originally offered by the factory. These limitations include:

- A maximum of 3 modifications, as long as they reasonably appear to be true to the factory appearance, including:
 - Paint color that was not offered by the factory, such as Candy Red, but otherwise appears to be a stock vehicle
 - Chrome air cleaner
 - Valve covers
 - Wheels
 - Headers
 - After-market intake
 - Engine/transmission swap that is stock in appearance
 - Addition of a wing or spoiler
- The following minor modifications are also allowed and not included in the three modifications listed above: battery, radio and tires.

Modified Vehicle Class

This classification includes vehicles that have four or more modifications, including those listed above. Typical modifications that classify your vehicle in this category include:

- Major body modifications like chop or wide body kit
- Custom color and paint
- Custom interior
- Custom underhood with modified engine
- Modern drivetrain such as a Gen III Hemi swap

Special Interest Vehicle Class

This classification includes all other vehicles that do not fit in either of the classes above, such as:

- Race-built vehicle – new or old
- Movie car
- Prototype
- MOPAR-powered boat, bike or chainsaw
- One-of-a-kind, out-of-the-ordinary vehicle with a special story
