

# Wonder Wednesday: Visible Mending

Wednesday, Nov. 20, noon–1:30 p.m., The Friends of the Littleton Library and Museum Lecture Hall

What is Visible Mending? The concept has gained popularity as people look to reduce waste, customize clothing and save money. Rather than patching or hiding repairs to ripped or worn clothing, we opt to repair with decorative stitching that is clearly visible, beautifully stitched and stronger.

We'll use the traditional Japanese embroidery, Sashiko stitching, to



repair small tears or worn spots in one of your favorite pieces of clothing. Building on the Sashiko stitching workshop held in June, attendees will apply those stitching skills to some visible mending projects. No worries if you weren't with us in June, we'll catch you up!

Bring a small piece of clothing or cloth with a bit of wear or a small tear to practice on. Visible mending is best done on cotton or other sturdy, natural fabrics. We'll start small, so you can move on to larger tears or holes at home. If you have a bit of fun fabric you'd like to patch, bring that as well. If not, we'll have fabric swatches to practice on. All materials will be provided.
