Thank you to Phyllis Larison, who is performing research for Ed Bemis' biography, for sharing this. When discussing social activities sponsored by the Episcopal church, Ed mentioned an annual Easter egg hunt that Richard Little held in the 1890s. "At Easter time, Mr. Little would hide colored eggs all around his place. His home was a stone house located at 215 Rapp Avenue. South of the house there was a gulch and then his place extended on to the old Episcopal Manse, which is now located at 317 Rapp Avenue. There are lots of trees and bushes through that area under which he hid these eggs. Mr. Little's annual Easter Egg Hunt was quite an

affair." Trust us, the Friends Easter Egg Hunt is usually quite an affair, too! I can't predict when things will return to normal in Littleton, but one thing I know for sure—you can get outside and enjoy our 7-mile Crabapple Route. 8 Things to Read, See & Do from Home



Visit the Bemis Public Library <u>Digital</u> <u>Downloads</u> page to find out how you can access the library's wealth of resources using your various devices. - 1. Read *A Grip of Time* by Lauren Kessler, a great book about a creative writing group in prison.
- 2. Delve into Littleton's history at <u>www.littletongov.org</u>, where you can read history and search the <u>museum's collection</u>. From the home page, click My Littleton to get started.
- 3. Listen to the audio book *Boys in the Boat* by Daniel James Brown, an inspiring account of the University of Washington rowing team in 1936 in its quest for Olympic gold.
- 4. Hear a Dial-A-Story from Bemis Library! Call 303-795-3960 and hear a storybook selection read by one of your favorite children's librarians.
- Watch one of your favorite actors read a picture book at <u>www.storylineonline.net</u>.



- 6. Visit <u>Scholastic Learn at Home</u> for daily projects to keep kids reading, thinking and growing.
- 7. Catch up on your reading, cleaning, organizing and yardwork!
- 8. Play Dungeons & Dragons, a role-playing game of imagination where you tell a collaborative story with your friends. The best part is, this game can be whatever you want it to be! Do you want to be a divine hero? A mischievous thief? A guardian of nature? A grumpy wizard? You can be all of those things and more! The basic rules of the game are available for free at <u>dndbeyond.com</u>, and more books are available at the library when we resume service! • \$30 for 2nd place winners



A SIMPLE WAY TO GIVE TO THE FRIENDS!

As of this tax year, the new Donate to a Colorado Nonprofit program called ReFUND CO allows taxpayers to directly support an eligible Colorado-registered charity with a simple designation on their state income tax return.

Last year alone, the state of Colorado issued almost \$1 billion in refunds to 1.9 million tax payers. Even if individuals only donated half or one-third of their refunds, that could equal more than \$333 million in philanthropic support for nonprofits in Colorado.
