

## Welcome Back! Bemis Library is Open

Bemis Public Library is open to the public on a limited basis with the following modified hours:

- Tuesday–Friday, 1–6 p.m.
- Saturday, 10 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Sunday-Monday, Closed

During this initial stage, building capacity will be limited to 60 people. Patrons will be admitted on a firstcome-first-served basis. Once the library's capacity has been reached, a policy of one-out-one-in will be implemented. Computer sessions will be limited to one hour per person per day.

When visiting the library, patrons are encouraged to limit the size of their group and keep time spent in the library to 60 minutes or less. Pets (except for trained service animals), food and beverages are not permitted in the library.

Masks or face coverings are required for staff and the public per the Governor's Executive Order D 2020 110.


### Vibrant Bounty Folk Art from the Shaanxi Region

Aug. 14–Oct. 17, Littleton Museum



The art in this exhibit journeys through Shaanxi Province, one of the cradles of Chinese civilization. The

capital city, Xi'an, was once the eastern terminus of the ancient Silk Road, and



is famous for its extensive archaeological finds, most notably the Mausoleum of Qin Shi

Huang and his Terracotta Army.

The artifacts in this collection explore China's rural life and they show, in detail, traditional Shaanxi customs. Objects range from children's clothing and toys to New Year's prints and decorative household items, often embroidered with lucky figures and animals. Not only are they carefully handmade and beautiful, they also hold symbolic wishes for good luck, good marriages and good health.

Both the art and the objects featured in this exhibition introduce a region of China, which, like so many parts of rural America, is dominated by agriculture and populated with hardworking people. Through these folk-art paintings and the artifacts that accompany them, viewers gain a greater understanding of the customs, culture and humanity of a people who share essential similarities—despite great distances. This exhibit was organized by ExhibitsUSA, a program of Mid-America Arts Alliance.
