
Bemis Library Holiday Programs

- Mobile Printing: During curbside hours
- Virtual Programming: Virtual programming continues for children, families, teens and adults; use the <u>calendar</u> to register or access programs
- **Digital Services:** Bemis website services and access to digital resources will continue without interruption
- Online Chat Service: Chat with a librarian to get help accessing eBooks, using digital resources and much more. Service is open Monday–Friday, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

Museum Services as of Nov. 20

With Arapahoe County moving to Level Red in response to the rise in COVID-19 cases, the Littleton Museum will close the main building but continue to provide public access to the 1860s and 1890s living history farms. Starting Saturday, Nov. 21, the museum will close to the public for 10 days to install a new entrance point through the building's education wing and out to the farms. The farms will reopen on Tuesday, Dec. 1, as a passive use park where visitors can stroll the walking paths and view the livestock and animals; the historic buildings will remain closed.

- Hours of Operation: Tuesday-Saturday, 9 a.m.–3 p.m.
- **Capacity:** 50 visitors per hour and reservations are required.
- **Requirements:** Visiting groups should be from the same household, maintain at least 6 feet of social distancing from other visitors, and are strongly encouraged to limit their time on the farms to 1 hour. No school or organized groups are permitted. *Masks required*.
- **Reservations:** Please call the museum at 303-795-3950.
