- **Curbside:** Curbside service is available on an as-needed basis during the library's hours of operations. Please call 303-795-3961 to schedule a same-day appointment.
- **Computers:** Computer sessions are limited to one hour per day. The meeting room, conference room, study room and computer lab remain closed.
- **Social Distancing & Masks:** Visitors should maintain at least 6 feet of social distancing from one other. Masks are required.
- **Digital Library:** 24/7 access to eBooks, audiobooks, streaming video, newspapers and magazines continues at <u>bemis.marmot.org</u>

Museum Access

On Jan. 26, 2021, the main building at the Littleton Museum reopened to the public with limited capacity.

- **Hours:** 9 a.m.–3 p.m., Tuesday–Saturday.
- **Capacity:** The museum has a limit of 50 visitors per hour and reservations are required.
- **Groups:** Visiting groups should be from the same household. No school or organized groups are permitted.
- **Social Distancing:** Visiting groups should maintain at least 6 feet of social distancing from other visitors, and are strongly encouraged to limit their time at the museum to one hour. Five people are allowed in the galleries at one time.
- Masks: Masks are required.
- **Reservations:** Please call the museum at 303-795-3950

Current Exhibits

The Littleton Museum has four galleries that highlight the history, art and culture of the community as well as traveling exhibits from the Smithsonian Institution and other museums.

- **Spirit:** The Littleton Gallery features the permanent exhibit "Littleton: Spirit of Community."
- **Fine Art:** The Fine Arts Gallery's traveling exhibit "Colorado Abstracted: Five Artists Capture the Transcendental Experience of Nature" runs through Feb. 27.
- **Toys:** The temporary exhibit "The Way We Played" remains on display in the Changing Gallery; this show has been extended into the summer.



• **Kids Connection:** The Kids Connection, a high-touch interactive experience for the Museum's youngest visitors, is closed due to the pandemic.
