

The living history farms at the Littleton Museum are now open to the public on a limited schedule! In compliance with the state's orders relating to parks and open spaces, the farms are open as passive use spaces. The walkways are open and the farm's livestock is available for viewing, but the historic buildings and interpetive programming are not available. Access to the farms is through the gate adjacent to the parking lot.

The gate is staffed during visiting hours. Visitors are strongly encouraged to wear masks or face coverings and to observe social distancing while on the museum grounds. As usual, pets are not allowed on the grounds (with the exception of service animals) and food and drink are not permitted. The farms are biw open Tuesday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.; closed holidays, weekends, and Mondays.
