I can't always be a Pollyanna—and I certainly wasn't when I heard about the financial state of the City of Littleton. We're facing a \$6.5 million revenue shortfall and one of the suggested fixes is to eliminate "community assets like Bemis Public Library and the Littleton Museum."

- Be realistic: Many of the things we love about Littleton cost money; either revenue has to increase or expenses have to decrease.

- Be glad: Appreciate that we have a highquality library and museum, and that you are instrumental in their future well-being.


