President's Message




Springtime. Spring is here, so let's get out and explore! Littleton offers many opportunities to venture out and enjoy everything our City has to offer. We

On April 6, National Library Worker Day, the library thanked staff for their hard work and dedication with a lovely brunch and a



May 21–July 17, 2021

The City of Littleton Fine Arts Board is pleased to announce an upcoming exhibition of fine art featuring the works of Ashley Allen and Olga and Aleksey Ivanov. The artists won Best of Show awards for competitive exhibitions in 2020: Allen for the 2020 Eye of the Camera exhibit, and the Ivanovs for the 2020 Own an Original exhibit.

Through a curated selection of these artists' recent works, "I and We" explores the concept of the individual versus the duo when considering artistic inspirations and processes. Allen,

whose work explores the role of the individual within familial groups, as well as one's relationship with nature, focuses on using photography to explore one's identity in the larger world. In contrast to the unique and dynamic role of the individual is the delicate and harmonious balance of a partnership. The Ivanovs are spouses who have worked together on paintings for more than 25 years. They collaborate symbiotically on each egg tempera painting they create, reflecting the strong bond they share as life partners.
