

## YOUTH EVENTS

**Weekly Story Times.** Join one of our weekly story times, which are geared toward individual age groups.

- **BABY.** For caregivers with babies from 0–12 months. Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m.
- **TODDLER.** For caregivers with toddlers (walkers) up to age 3 years. Tuesdays at 9:30 a.m.
- **PRESCHOOL.** Ages 3 years and older. Fridays at 10:30 a.m.
- **BOOKS and BLANKETS.** A family story time for all ages. Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. and Thursdays at 9:30 and 10:30 a.m. Bring your kids and blankets for 30 minutes of stories and songs, shared while socially distancing outside on the lawn at the library. Story time will be held outdoors unless temperatures are below 45° or in the case of high winds, snow, or rain. When this occurs, story time will be held inside.

**Nov. 5: LEGO Club.** All ages, come build with us. Design, construct and create your own LEGO creations. Build from a theme or use your imagination to make a brand-new creation. Children under 8 must be accompanied by an adult. 3–4 p.m.

**Nov. 8: Sensory Story Time.** Caregivers and children of all abilities are welcome. Join us for an inclusive and interactive story time designed for children who are neurodivergent and/or have sensory needs. Light and sound are decreased. The library will provide sensory toys, fidgets and noise canceling headphones for anyone who needs them.
