Friends Craft Fair on Hiatus for 2020

The health and safety of our community is the No. 1 priority for the Friends of the Littleton Library and Museum. To protect crafters, shoppers and staff, the Friends board has made the difficult decision to cancel the Friends Craft Fair scheduled for Oct. 3 in Ketring Park.

In working closely with Tri-County Health, we realized that complying with their requirements would be difficult and severely restrict attendance. Requirements included limiting attendance to 175 people at a time, maintaining social distance standards, creating a fenced perimeter, enforcing one-way traffic, increased sanitation, providing only contactless payment and more.

Since 1971, the Friends Craft Fair has been a beloved Littleton tradition featuring 300+ talented artisans and crafters, and the Friends look forward to hosting another wonderful fair in 2021.

Visiting the Library

Bemis Public Library is open to the public on a limited basis with the following modified hours:

- Tuesday–Friday, 1–6 p.m.
- Saturday, 10 a.m.-3 p.m.
- Sunday-Monday, Closed

Guidelines for visiting the library:

- Patrons are encouraged to limit the size of their group and keep time spent in the library to 60 minutes or less.
- Computer sessions will be limited to one hour per person per day.
- Building capacity is limited to 60 people. Patrons will be admitted on a first-come-first-served basis.
- Once the library's capacity has been reached, a policy of one-out-one-in will be implemented.
- Pets (except for trained service animals) and food and beverages are not permitted in the library.
- Masks or face coverings are required for staff and the public per the Governor's Executive Order D 2020 110.

Vibrant Bounty

Folk Art from the Shaanxi Region

Aug. 14–Oct. 17, Littleton Museum
The art in this exhibit journeys through
Shaanxi Province, one of the cradles
of Chinese civilization. The capital city,
Xi'an, was once the eastern terminus
of the ancient Silk Road, and is famous
for its extensive archaeological finds,
most notably the Mausoleum of Qin
Shi Huang and his Terracotta Army.

The artifacts in this collection explore China's rural life and they show, in detail, traditional Shaanxi customs. Objects range from children's clothing and toys to New Year's prints and decorative household items, often embroidered with lucky figures and animals. Not only are they carefully handmade and beautiful, they also hold symbolic wishes for good luck, good marriages and good health.

Through these folk-art paintings and the artifacts that accompany them, viewers gain a greater understanding of the customs, culture and humanity of a people who share essential similarities—despite great distances. This exhibit was organized by ExhibitsUSA, a program of Mid-America Arts Alliance.
