

Water Is for Fightin', Tuesday, March 18, 6:30 p.m. In the high and arid West, water determines success and failure, life and death. In *Little Britches:* Father and I Were Ranchers, Ralph Moody recalls the threat of violence and conflict he witnessed in the early 1900s during a dry season. Join Professor Michael Welsh to learn about the history of water in Colorado and the laws regulating this precious resource.

Ralph Moody's Littleton, Tuesday, March 25, 6:30 p.m. When Ralph Moody's family moved to Colorado in 1906, Ralph was 8 years old and Littleton was a small town far from the bustle of Denver. Join Littleton Museum curator Jenny Hankinson for a presentation through historic images and artifacts from the museum collection.

For the Kids: Stick Pony Roundup Saturday, March 22. Ralph Moody had to help his parents around the ranch before he could ride his horse in *Little Britches*. Make your own stick pony, help out with "chores," and test your galloping skills in the roundup.


