The North Carolina Fourth of July Celebration Boasts Activities, Events, an Arts & Crafts Market, and Entertainment.

amilies looking for a unique Fourth of July destination need look no further than Southport, North Carolina, which boasts a celebration first recorded in a newspaper in 1795. Now the official State of North Carolina's celebration, the event attracts more than 50,000 visitors each year and has expanded to encompass activities at nearby Oak Island. Through the years, the efforts of civic groups and citizens have evolved and now encompass a wide variety of American celebration traditions. The celebration includes activities and events for the young and the more seasoned young at heart.



Event highlights include arts and crafts on the Southport waterfront, a parade, fireworks, firefighters' competition, children's games, live entertainment, great food, and lots of red, white, and blue.

The welcoming ceremony in Southport will be held on the Fort Johnston lawn in Southport on June 28 at 6:30pm. This will be followed by a reading of the Declaration of Independence, a nod to the Festival's mission of patriotism. The Welcoming Ceremony on Oak Island will be Saturday, June 29 at 5:45pm. at Middleton Park Extension. It will be followed by a Beach Day Concert featuring 20 Ride.

Patriotism is woven into the celebration via events such as the Salute to Veterans, a 9/11 Remembered

Traveling Memorial, a Naturalization Ceremony, Flag Retirement Ceremony, Flag Raising Ceremony and a military and first responder equipment exhibition.

For the more energetic, activities include a beach day full of activities – including corn hole, bocce ball and volleyball tournaments and children's activities – in Oak Island. There will be live pro wrestling and an Uncle Sam skydive on Oak Island, as well. Southport will also host games and entertainment.

This year's Fourth of July Festival is online now. The website is also your source for entry forms for events such as the Freedom Run, the Red, White, and Blue Flotilla, and the parade. You may also sign up to become a sponsor. Sponsors allow the festival to keep all events free to the public. Family and corporate sponsorships are available, so there is a giving level for everyone.

Red, White and Blue Flotilla

This annual event continues to draw spectators along the waterfront, up and down the Intracoastal Waterway and river. Come watch or participate in this year's Red, White, and Blue Freedom Flotilla, scheduled to begin at 4 p.m. on Tuesday, July 2nd. Spectators will enjoy patriotically be dazzled vessels of all shapes and sizes. A longer route in 2024 means more opportunities for the public to enjoy the event. The parade route will begin from the Old Yacht Basin, pass along the Southport Waterfront to just past Kingsley Park to marker 19, return past the Old Yacht Basin, and continue to the St James Plantation Marina.

Salute to Veterans

The 2024 Salute Veterans, featuring a main stage performance by Letters From Home. The performance

will be on Tuesday, July 2nd, at 5:30 pm at Waterfront Stage in Southport, N.C. The public is invited to enjoy this special evening to honor our veterans.

We invite all veterans to the wharf where special seating will be available. Veterans will have access to the facilities at the North Carolina 4th of July Festival's Hospitality House, which is The Southport Community Building, and will be provided light refreshments under the shade of the reserved seating at the waterfront.

Veterans who need transportation from Moore Street to the waterfront stage will be taken by golf cart from the corner of Moore Street and Davis Street. Parking is available in the surrounding area or for veterans at the Brunswick Community College at 701 N. Lord Street. General parking is available at the Southport Elementary School at 701 W. 9th Street, Southport, NC. Shuttle services will be provided from both locations.





Naturalization Ceremony

The 25th annual Naturalization Ceremony on July 3rd on the Ft. Johnston Garrison Lawn beginning at 2:30pm. This annual Festival feature will be preceded by a band concert with music from the 440th Army Band. The concert will be fol-



lowed by Amuzu Theatre Singers.

The ceremony is a significant part of the annual North Carolina 4th of July Festival in Southport. It is anticipated that 125 new citizens will be administered the oath of citizenship by Honorable Richard E. Myers II, Chief U.S. District Judge, Eastern District of North Carolina.

Firefighter's Freedom Competition

The Southport Fire Department will present the 39th Annual Fire-fighter's Freedom Competition on Saturday, June 29th, at 3pm at the Southport Fire Substation at 115 E. Nash Street Southport.





Donors may drive up to the hospital front entrance on Wednesday July 10th between the hours of 9:00am and 1:00pm to drop off healthy, non-perishable food items to members of hospital and BWC staff, who will coordinate distribution to local food pantries through South Brunswick PORCH and other non-profit organizations that promote access in nutritious foods. Items of particular need are:

- Fruit & vegetable juices, no added sugar
- Low sugar granola bars and fruit snacks
- Low sodium canned beans or soups
- Canned tuna and chicken

- Rice (Brown or whole grain)
- Gatorade (low/no sugar)
- Pudding (Sugar Free)
- Bottled water
- Cereals (whole grain/low sugar)
- BOOST drinks
- Jelly (low/no sugar)
- Nut butters/no added sugar & low salt (no glass jars, please)
- Healthy snacks for children (low sodium chips, veggie chips, fruit cups)

BWC Executive Director, Dr. Leigh Lane, said, "There is a high need for food pantry supplies during the summer due to pantries compensating for meals children receive at school. Not only will the donation drive at Dosher fill a need in food insecure communities, but it will also promote access to healthy foods, including the daily recommendation of 5 servings of fruits and vegetables."

Over 2,000 pounds of food were collected at last year's event.

harks are making their way north as our waters warm during the summer months!

Remember that when you enter the water, you enter the food chain. But there are things to do that can help you AVOID a shark encounter.

People often ask what they can wear to avoid sharks. Here are some helpful tips ...

- Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or bright clothing: Sharks are attracted to shiny objects, so avoid wearing jewelry or clothing that reflects light. particularly in murky waters such as ours. A shark may confuse shiny jewelry as the reflection of fish scales.
- Don't wear high-contrast clothing. This also can be mistaken for fish scales or prev. Divers and snorkelers should lean towards dark dive gear such as fins, suits, tanks and goggles. Color is not a factor for sharks as previously thought. Sharks don't see in color, but they can see contrast verv well..
- Stay in a group as opposed to swimming alone. A shark is an opportunistic hunter and will "fish beach, but be SHARK SMART!

out" injured or east prey.

- Don't swim at dusk or dawn. Sharks use the sun to hunt during these times the most. When you look at the water facing the direction of the sun, you'll notice that you can't really see anything in the water. Look in the opposite direction and you can see it much better.
- Avoid excessive splashing and movement in the water. Sharks can hear far away and splashing mimicks a fish in distress which makes for an easy meal.
- If you see schools of fish jumping in and out of the water, that means there's something chasing them. Stay away from this scenario as well.

Visit the Oak Island Ocean Education Center on the corner of East Oak Island Drive and NE 47th Street, across from Town Hall. You will find lots of information about these amazing apex predotors and why they are so important to the balance of our marine environment.





The Sheriff's Office utilizes the BCSO Mobile App and Facebook to alert the community of any scams that we know are making their way through our community. The "jury scam" is one that has been especially problematic lately. With this scam, someone will contact you by phone claiming you have missed jury duty, and if you don't pay (usually via gift card or cash apps), you will be served with warrants and arrested. These scammers are even using real Brunswick County Sheriff's Office employee names and the number appears to come from the Sheriff's Office. We want our community to know, we will never call a citizen and demand money of any kind. We will not ask for any banking or personal finance information. If you receive a call like this, it is a scam. If you are at all worried you have missed jury duty, call the Brunswick County Courthouse. They will be able to





It's Hurricane Season. Are You Prepared?



he eastern Pacific hurricane season runs from May 15 to November 30.

However, the best time to prepare is well before the official start of the season. Avoid having to rush through potentially life-saving preparations by waiting until it's too late. Get your disaster supplies while the shelves are still stocked, and get that insurance checkup early, as flood insurance requires a 30-day waiting period.

Develop an evacuation plan

If you are at risk from hurricane impacts, you need an evacuation plan. Now is the time to begin planning where you would go and how you would get there. You do not need to travel hundreds of miles. Your destination could be a friend or relative who lives in a well built home outside flood prone areas. Plan several routes. Be sure to account for your pets.

If you don't have a vehicle, check with local officials to see what transportation options they may have available.

Assemble disaster supplies

Whether you're evacuating or sheltering-in-place, you're going to need supplies not just to get through the storm but for the potentially lengthy and unpleasant aftermath. Have enough non-perishable food, water and medicine to last each person in your family a minimum of 3 days (store a longer than 3-day supply of water, if possible). Electricity and water could be out for weeks. You'll need extra cash, a battery-powered radio and flashlights. You may need a portable crank or solar-powered USB charger for your cell phones. And lastly, don't forget your pets!

Get an insurance checkup & document your possessions

Call your insurance company or

agent and ask for an insurance checkup to make sure you have enough insurance to repair or even replace your home and/or belongings. Remember, home and renters insurance doesn't cover flooding, so you'll need a separate policy for it. Flood insurance is available through your company, agent, or the National Flood Insurance Program at floodsmart. gov. Act now, as flood insurance requires a 30-day waiting period.

Take the time before hurricane season begins to document your possessions: photos, serial numbers, or anything else that you may need to provide your insurance company when filing a claim.

Create a communication plan

Take the time now to write down your hurricane plan, and share it with your family. Determine family meeting places, and make sure to include an out-of-town location in case of evacuation. Write down on paper a list of emergency contacts, and make sure to include utilities and other critical services — remember, the internet may not be accessible during or after a storm.

Strengthen your home

Now is the time to improve your home's ability to withstand hurricane impacts. Trim trees. Install storm shutters, accordion shutters, and/or impact glass. Seal outside wall openings. Remember, the garage door is the most vulnerable part of the home, so it must be able to withstand hurricane-force winds. Many retrofits are not as costly or time consuming as you may think. If you're a renter, work with your landlord now to prepare for a storm.

And remember - now is the time to purchase the proper plywood, steel or aluminum panels to have on hand if you need to board up the windows and doors ahead of an approaching storm.

Pets and Fireworks Don't Mix

ireworks, picnics and other is your yard secure enough to keep Fourth of July traditions can be great fun for people; but all of the festivities can be frightening and even dangerous for animals. Noisy fireworks and other celebrations can startle animals and cause them to run away; holiday foods can be unhealthy; summer heat and travel can be dangerous; and potentially dangerous debris can end up lying on the ground where pets can eat or play with it.

Whether or not you're planning your own Independence Day celebration, it's important to take precautions to keep your pets safe both during and after Fourth of July fes-

Preparing in Advance

Make sure your pets - cats and dogs alike - have identification tagsor are micro-chipped with up-todate information. If you have horses, you might consider marking a safety (breakaway) halter with your contact information and leaving it on your horse during this stressful time.

Take a current photo of all of your cats, dogs and horses - just in case.

If your pet has historically been anxious on this holiday, or if you have reason to expect potentially harmful reactions, consider behavioral therapy to desensitize your pet and reduce the risk of problems. Some pets may need medication. Consult your veterinarian or a veterinary behaviorist.

Make sure the environment is safe and secure. If your neighbors set off fireworks at an unexpected time, your pet contained? Are pasture fences secure enough to keep horses or other livestock confined? Evaluate your options, and choose the safest area for your animals; and make improvements if needed to make the area more secure.

Safety During July 4th Celebrations

Leave your pets indoors at home when you go to parties, fireworks displays, parades and other gatherings. Loud fireworks, unfamiliar places and crowds can all be very frightening to pets, and there's great risk of pets becoming spooked and running

Keep sparklers, glow sticks, fireworks, charcoal and kabob skewers away from curious pets.

Don't let pets get near your barbecue grill while it is in use or still hot.

Avoid the urge to feed your pets table scraps or other foods intended for people. Be especially careful to keep them away from these common foods that are actually toxic.

Remember that too much sun and heat (and humidity!) can be dangerous to pets. Keep them inside when it's extremely hot/humid; make sure they have access to shady spots and plenty of water when outdoors; don't leave them outside for extended pe-



Consider putting your pets in a safe, escape-proof room or crate during parties and fireworks.

Keep horses and livestock in safely fenced areas and as far from the excitement and noise as possible.

If you're hosting guests, ask them to help keep an eye on your pets to make sure they don't escape. Placing notes on exit doors and gates can help both you and your guests remain vigilant.

Getting to Know Rip Currents

ip currents are channelized currents of water flowing away from shore at surf beaches.

Rip currents typically form at breaks in sandbars, and also near structures such as jetties and piers.

Rip currents are commonly found on all surf beaches, including Great Lakes beach-

Why are rip currents dangerous?

Rip currents pull people away from shore.

Rip current speeds can vary from moment to moment and can quickly increase to become dangerous to anyone entering the surf.

Rip currents can sweep even the strongest swimmer away from shore.

What are clues that rip currents may be present?

A narrow gap of darker, seemingly calmer water between areas of breaking waves and whitewater.

A channel of churning, choppy water.

A difference in water color.

A line of foam, seaweed or debris moving seaward.

How can I protect myself and my family from rip currents?

Always swim in an area protected by lifeguards

Consult lifeguards before entering the water.

Assume that rip currents are always present at surf beaches.

Learn to swim in the surf and make sure your children can swim in the surf. Pool swimming is not the same as swimming at a surf beach.

Learn to identify rip currents and take the time to evaluate the water before you enter the water.

What if I'm caught in a rip current?

Relax, rip currents don't pull you under.

Don't swim against the current.

You may be able to escape by



swimming out of the current in a direction following the shoreline, or toward breaking waves, then at an angle toward the beach.

You may be able to escape by floating or treading water if the current circulates back toward shore.

If you feel you will be unable to reach shore, draw attention to yourself. If you need help, yell and wave for assistance.

How do I help someone else?

Don't become a victim while trying to help someone else! Many people have died trying to rescue rip current victims.

Get help from a lifeguard.

If a lifeguard is not present, call 9-1-1, then try to direct the victim to swim following the shoreline to escape.

If possible, throw the rip current victim something that floats.

Never enter the water without a flotation device.

Facts about rip currents

Rip currents do not pull people under the water—they pull people away from shore.

Rip current speeds vary. Average speeds are 1-2 feet per second, but they have been measured as fast as 8 feet per second-faster than an Olympic swimmer!

Rip currents can be very narrow or more than 50 yards wide.

Sometimes a rip current ends just beyond the line of breaking waves; however, others may continue to flow hundreds of yards offshore.

Rip currents are sometimes mistakenly called undertow or riptides but these terms are not correct. Only the term rip currents is technically correct.







Ocean Isle Beach Sea Turtle Protection Organization Amber Light Project

he Town of OIB has approved20 amber streetlights. In order to get this approved, the OIBSTPO agreed to pay \$2,100 per streetlights and \$328.80 per streetlight to cover the difference in cost of operating the fixtures. The cost is higher to make sure the streetlight is also safe for people. We raised enough money for the first 10 streetlights \$21,000 and \$3,288 for the first year of operating costs.

Sea turtles are highly affected by artificial lights, particularly during their nesting season. Female sea turtles come ashore to lay their eggs on beaches, and they rely on natural light to guide them back to the ocean after they have finished nesting. Artificial lights from buildings, street-lights, and beachfront properties can



disorient them and lead them away from the ocean, causing them to become exhausted and vulnerable to predators.

In addition, hatchlings are also affected by artificial lights when they emerge from their nests and instinctively head towards the brightest light, which should be the reflection of the moon on the ocean. However, artificial lights can lead them in the wrong direction, towards roads, buildings, or other dangerous areas.

To mitigate the impact of artificial lights on sea turtles, conservation efforts often involve implementing lighting ordinances that regulate the use of lights near nesting beaches. This can include using turtle-friendly lighting fixtures that emit a specific wavelength of light that is less disruptive to sea turtles, as well as installing shields or barriers to direct light away from the beach.

Reducing the impact of artificial lights on sea turtles is crucial for their survival and plays a significant role in conservation efforts to protect these endangered species.

Oak Island Installs 'Beach Warning Light' Signs

n Tuesday, June 11, 2024 crews with the Town of Oak Island Public Works Department installed four (4) NEW Beach Warning Lights signs. These new signs feature a fully automated wireless control system, which retrieves updates from the National Weather Service, and then displays the current Beach Warning condition on the built-in signal light. This new notification system will greatly enhance the safety and visibility provided by the robust Beach Warning Flag system already in place.

With this installation, Oak Island has become the first town in the Carolinas to utilize this system.

Lighted Beach Warning Signs

The signage was developed by SwimSmart Warning Systems out of Marquette, Michigan who has designed and installed similar systems in numerous states throughout the East Coast, the West Coast, and the Great Lakes regions. The signs are completely self-contained, utilizing-solar options for power and onboard data receivers for information.

Outgoing Town Manager, David Kelly began discussions with SwimSmart in mid-2023, immediately starting work to design a system for Oak Island. The Town's signs are unique, as they are the also first of their kind to incorporate a PURPLE light, to indicate the risk of "stinging marine life" such as jellyfish or Man O' War.

The four units have been installed near the more heavily populated



- Barbee Boulevard (near the Oak Island Pier)
- Oak Island Cabana (Middleton Park Complex)
- 3rd Place East (near S Middleton Ave.)
- The Point (end of W Oak Island Dr.)

Their effectiveness and durability will be evaluated during the 2024 Summer Season, to determine any possible expansion or adapting of the program in the future. While the lighted signs provide beachgoers with conditions at a quick glance, it is still recommended to check the Beach Safety page of the Town Website for full forecast and safety information

This page also contains important information on Rip Current Safety, "what to do" in an emergency, and how to use the Rescue Tubes.



Ocean Isle Beach

Currently, parking is free at beach accesses at Ocean Isle, including more than 200 spaces. Though overnight parking is not allowed in the town-owned spaces.

Parking is paid at the Ocean Isle Pier for \$10 daily, \$45 weekly and \$175 seasonally. It's free after 6 p.m.

There is also a private-owned lot that charges fees, but is not operated by the town.

Sunset Beach

Sunset Beach is one of the remaining beaches to offer parking for free in Brunswick County. However, parking at the pier is \$10 per day with seasonal passes available through a lottery.

Holden Beach & Oak Island

Holden Beach and Oak Island utilize the Otto app for the their paid

Oak Island: Marked spaces are paid April 1 through Sept. 30, 9am to 5pm.

Paid Parking and Resident-Only parking are enforced in all areas within the Paid Parking Zone, unless otherwise noted. This zone consists of the beachfront areas south of the Davis Canal (up to SE 40th St) and E Oak Island Drive (for areas EAST of SE 40th St).

Parking is NOT CHARGED during special events at the Middleton Park Complex (from SE 46th Street to SE 49th Street), such as the Farmers' & Artisans' Market.

Parking is also NOT CHARGED in the Oak Island Pier parking lot at 705 Ocean Drive, where parking is limited to 2 hours.

- Hourly: \$5 up to three hours
- Daily: \$20 per day or any duration greater than four hours
- Weekly: \$80 per week for seven consecutive days
- Annually: \$175, with a limit of 500 passes sold



Town Earns NC Department of Labor Safety Awards for Second Consecutive Year

he Town of Leland has received five awards from the North Carolina Department of Labor (NCDOL) Safety Awards Program. This is the second time the Town's Safety & Wellness Committee has applied to this program and received awards.

The Town received gold awards for Town Hall, the Leland Cultural Arts Center, Fire Station 51, and Fire Station 53. The Town also received the silver award for the Municipal Operations Center.

According to the NCDOL, the Safety Awards Program recognizes private firms and public agencies throughout the state that achieve and maintain outstanding safety records. The program is designed to stimulate interest in accident prevention and to promote safety in the workplace by providing an incentive to employers and employees to maintain a safe and healthy workplace.

NCDOL representatives presented Town staff with the awards during a ceremony on May 21.

To qualify for an annual safety award, NCDOL states that an agency must have had no fatalities at the site during the calendar year for which the award is given and must have maintained either a perfect safety record for that year or an incidence rate at least 50 percent below the average for its particular industry group. There are two levels under the annual safety awards program: gold and silver. The gold award is based on the days away, restricted, transferred (DART) rate, which includes cases of days away from work, restricted activity, or job transfer. The silver award is based only on cases with days away from work. They are recorded when the worker misses at least one full day of work, not including the day of the injury.

Prescription Drop Boxes Available

t is estimated that thousands of Other Permanent youths abuse or sell medications that they obtain from the family medicine cabinet. Also, people often dispose of unwanted medications in an unsecured or improper manner.

The Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department offers a safe and convenient way to dispose of unused medications.

A permanent drop box has been placed in the lobby of the Boiling Spring Lakes Police Department, and the box is available to the public Monday through Friday 8am-4:30pm. Residents may simply bring their unwanted medications to the police department lobby, follow the instructions located on the drop box, and discard their medications.

While most prescription medications may be discarded in the drop box, residents should not use this service for the following:

- Needles, Syringes, or Lancets
- Intravenous (IV) Bags or Liquid
- Thermometers
- Personal Care Items
- Used Gauze or Bandages
- Bloody or Infections Waste
- Over the Counter Medications


