Southport's Annual 4th of July Festival June 28-July 4

ome celebrate the patriotic spirit of America in Southport. For over 200 years, we've honored our nation's independence in grand style. From colonial times to today, it has grown into a cherished event. Each year, 40,000 to 50,000 people gather to commemorate Old Glory. Established in 1972 as the NC 4th of July Festival, the focus remains on honoring our nations birthday. Join us for a delightful experience filled with traditions and merriment. Southport's festival ingnites hearts with American pride.



Arts and Crafts Show - July 2-4

The N.C. 4th of July Festival Arts and Crafts show had its humble beginnings as a street fair near Leggett's (now Ocean Outfitters) on East Moore Street. Over time, it grew in popularity and underwent a few location changes until it finally settled in Franklin Square Park. Franklin Square Park, situated adjacent to the Southport Baptist Church at the corner of N. Howe and E. West Streets, became its permanent home.

Concessions

A variety of food and drink are available during the festival to fill you up as you partake in the numerous festival events. Your sense of smell will perk up when you near the concession areas. You will be tempted by the aroma of hot dogs, Greek gyros, Italian sausage, shrimp baskets, barb-que, blooming onions, and fries to funnel cakes, kettle corn, ice cream, cotton candy, and shaved ice.



Parade

The current N.C. 4th of July Festival Parade began in 1964 but has roots dating back to 1700's, when the ladies of Smithville (now the City of Southport) dressed in white and marched through the town in observance of Independence Day. Today's parade is much longer and has a bigger variety, with over 120 units filling the streets. An extra special treat is that the newly crowned Miss North Carolina makes one of her first appearances in the festival parade.

Veterans Recognition

The Veteran Recognition Ceremony is a mainstay of the July 4th Festival. During the many celebrations, it allows the public to stop and remember those who serve our country, protecting our freedoms. We encourage all Veterans in the area to attend. Dinner will be provided and seating is limited; this event is first come, first serve.



Annual Fire Fighters Freedom Competition & Apparatus Expo

This event, organized by the Southport Fire Department, has drawn firefighters from area fire departments to compete since 1984. What looks like fun games to the spectators is really an event to test the teamwork of a department, as it pays homage to the training and firefighting methods of our past. Take, for example, the bucket brigade. It was the method of extinguishing fires until the invention of the handpumped fire engine. A tremendous amount of teamwork and physical endurance, the key to an effective fire department, is needed to complete this duty.

The competitive events include Tanker Tug, Command Post, Bucket Brigade, Benjamin Franklin Impersonator, Extrication Demonstration, Mystery Event, Fire Extinguisher Demonstration, and Barrel Push, as



well as this year's newest activity, a pie-eating contest. Appearances by Sparky, Smokey, and Marshal from Paw Patrol[®]. Fire engines, ladder trucks, and equipment will be displayed, and firefighters will be available to answer any questions.

Beach Day

Beach Day is filled with fun and family-friendly activities organized by the Oak Island Recreation Department; with events held in collaboration with the North Carolina 4th of July Festival, as part of the larger schedule of activities hosted throughout the week to commemorate our Nation's Independence Day.

Fireworks

Oak Island will lead the way with a show from Oak Island Pier that starts at 9 p.m. and caps a day's worth of Beach Day activities marking the anniversary of the town's founding.

The pier is at 705 Ocean Drive, but the show should be visible from miles away, including Caswell Beach, the western portion of Oak Island, and even the waterfront in Southport, depending on the cloud coverage.

This year's 4th of July celebration includes a barge-mounted fireworks show from the **Southport water-front** at 9 p.m. that is expected to last for at least 20 minutes.

The start will include a red burst for the blood shed by heroes, a white burst for the light of freedom, and a blue burst for courage to stand tall.



25th Annual Brunswick Arts Council Art Show August 5 - August 15, 2025



his show is open to Adult Artists 18 and older who are residents of Brunswick County and/or who are paid members of the Art League of Leland, Associated Artists of Southport, Oak Island Art Guild, Waterway Art Association, Coastal Carolina Camera Club or the Brunswick Arts Council. Brunswick County Teens (rising 9th grade to just age 18) are eligible to enter the Teen Category. Teens over 18 should enter the Adult Category.

\$6,000 in Awards!

The awards ceremony is open to all artists and guests. The Art Exhibition is open to the public at no charge.

Conditions

Entries must be original works, not previously shown at the BAC Annual Art Show. Ceramics, drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, or a combination of the listed media created in the last three vears (2022-2025) will be considered. 2D art works must be suitably mounted and securely wired ready to hang (no sawtooth hangers). All entries must not exceed 40" in any direction, including the frame. 3D work must not exceed 50 pounds. No entry that requires the artist to be present for moving or assembly will be accepted. BAC reserves the right to change submission categories if sign-up category criteria isn't met. By submitting your artwork, your agreement to these conditions is implied.

Registration Form & Entry Fee

Only two entries into each category. An artist may submit more than one entry. Submit a non-refunda-

ble entry fee of \$45 (Adult) & \$10 (Teen). (Example: entry number 1 could have two pieces in Painting and entry number 2 could have two pieces in a 3-D.) Pay online or make checks payable to: Brunswick Arts Council.

The registration form and entry fee must be received by BAC no later than Saturday, August 2, 2025. This is the ONLY registration option.

Works must be hand delivered on Monday, August 4, 2025 from 10 am-2pm to the Leland Cultural Arts Center, Leland NC.

Elevating Access

A Capital Improvement Project to Increase Accessibility at the Museum.

or more than 34 years, the Museum's saltwater aquariums, live touch tank, interactive exhibits, lectures, and family programs have made it a popular destination for local residents and tourists from across the country. However, the Museum has several accessibility challenges that limit its functionality and ability to serve all visitors. Therefore, the Ocean Isle Museum Foundation has launched a capital improvement project, Elevating Access, to make essential building modifications to the Museum that will increase accessibility.

Project Overview

The project includes, refitting restroom facilities, the addition of handrails along interior ramps between exhibits and the construction of an addition to house an elevator which will provide access to the Hayden O'Neil Learning Center, a multi-purpose education space on an upper level, and the Barrier Island Gallery on the lower level. Both these areas currently can only be reached by stairs.

It's all part of a master plan for the Museum's 14,000-square-foot building, a process that engaged a broad cross-section of stakeholders, including Board members, government, nonprofit, and business leaders, and donors, members, and volunteers. The resulting ten-year plan identified the need to increase accessibility for patrons, rearrange exhibits to provide for a more effective traffic flow, relocate the retail area to attract more sales, and increase exhibit space. But last year the organization's board of trustees identified accessibility as its most pressing need. As a result, we launched the Elevating Access project.

Need For the Project

The U.S. Census Bureau reports that Brunswick County has been North Carolina's fastest-growing county since 2020. From 2021 to 2022, its population increased by

8,250, a growth rate of 5.7%, and now exceeds 153,000 residents. In 2021, the Annual Disability Statistics Compendium reported that 15.2% of County residents had a disability.

Additionally, seniors will benefit from this project. The 2022 U.S. Census reports that 34% of Brunswick County residents are 65 and older. Many of the Museum's patrons are seniors visiting with their grand-children, and most of the Museum's approximately 100 volunteers, many serving as docents are over 65. This project will ensure they can fully engage with visitors in all exhibits and programs.

The Museum aims to create a welcoming environment that serves diverse audiences, promotes equal access, and ensures all visitors enjoy a complete and enriching experience. Elevating Access positions the Museum for sustained success and greater community impact for the growing communities it serves.

In addition to general audiences, which include local residents and tourists, students will benefit from this project. The Museum's interactive exhibits and education programs are critical resources, providing essential STEM learning activities that align with North Carolina Standards of Learning for grades K-6. Nearly 3,500 students visit annually, primarily from Brunswick County elementary and middle schools, all of which are Title 1 schools. Students also come from the North Carolina counties of New Hanover, Columbus, Pender, Onslow, Duplin, Horry, and even as far away as Durham. Because some exhibit spaces and the Learning Center are currently only accessible by stairs, installing an elevator will provide students with equal access.

Dosher Hospital Foundation Receives \$40,000 Grant from **Louis Bacon's Orton Foundation**

Foundation announced that it is the recipient of a \$40,000 grant from the Orton Foundation, the North Carolina affiliate of The Moore Charitable Foundation. The funds will be allocated to Dosher Hospital's new Emergency Department, which treats more than 12,000 patients per year and which has earned two national awards for providing high patient satisfaction.

Dosher Memorial Hospital is building an 8,000 sq. ft. ED complex expansion to handle the projected volume increase of patients. The Total Service Area (TSA) population is projected to increase by 8% (2,615 people) over the next five years. The new space will include 9 patient care rooms and 5 vertical care rooms. Grant funds will allow Dosher Hospital to grow and build upon the 2022 Mindray Cardiac Monitor that Orton Foundation funded and provide the infrastructure needed in the new ED space. The current antenna infrastructure that supports the monitors was put in place in 2011/2013 but is not robust enough to handle the clinical needs for today's higher acuity healthcare environment. Therefore, new antennas and additional Mindray patient

osher Memorial Hospital monitors are needed to support the new space.

> Lynda Stanley, President and CEO of Dosher Memorial Hospital said, "The Dosher Emergency Department is central to our mission of providing extraordinary care for our community. We are extremely grateful to The Orton Foundation for their generous support of the Dosher Emergency Department. Over the vears, their charitable donations of over \$315,000 have enabled us to upgrade medical equipment, such as the infrastructure needed for the Mindray Cardiac Monitor, to ensure the most positive outcomes for our patients.

Southport Reminds Public: Metal Detecting and Treasure Hunting are Prohibited on Protected Historic Sites

he City of Southport would like to remind residents and visitors that metal detecting, treasure hunting, and unauthorized digging are strictly prohibited on protected historic sites within the city. Several key locations in Southport are listed on the National Register of Historic Places and are legally protected under both state and federal law.

Protected Properties Include:

- Fort Johnston premises including the grounds, lawn, and the entire North Carolina Maritime Museum at Southport site
- Old Brunswick County Courthouse / Old City Hall
- Old Brunswick County Jail
- John N. Smith Cemetery, the newest addition to the National Register

Federal laws such as the Archae-

ological Resources Protection Act (ARPA) and North Carolina's own Archaeological Resources Protection Act prohibit unauthorized excavation or artifact removal on these properties. Violators may face fines of up to \$2,000 per day, imprisonment for up to six months, and confiscation of equipment.

"The preservation of Southport's historic sites is critical to maintaining our city's unique heritage," said Jessie Labell, Assistant Director of Community Relations. "We urge everyone to respect these protected areas and report any unauthorized activity immediately."

What to Do if You Discover Artifacts

If you accidentally discover an artifact or historical item, do not disturb or remove it. Instead, report your find to one of the following local institutions:

- Fort Johnston Visitors Center and Museum
- North Carolina Maritime Museum at Southport
- Brunswick Town/Fort Anderson State Historic Site
- Fort Fisher State Historic Site

These locations will ensure proper documentation, evaluation, and preservation of historic artifacts.

How to Report Suspicious Activity

Residents who witness illegal metal detecting or digging on protected lands should report the activity promptly:

here were two drone incursions recently over the Sunset Road Fire, an active wildfire, in Brunswick County. While these drones were in the air, firefighting aircraft had to be grounded for 45 minutes. When a wildfire runs and spreads rapidly, every minute counts.

Flying a drone near or over a wildfire is ILLEGAL. Don't do it.

Firefighting aircraft that respond to wildfires fly low in support of ground personnel. Drones can pose a serious threat to pilot and public safety. A drone that disrupts air operations also puts firefighters, residents and property at risk of loss to wildfire.

Oftentimes, media outlets, other first responders and private landowners deploy drones near or over wildfires. It isn't ok. It's dangerous ... until it's deadly. Don't do it.

It's illegal to fly a drone near or over a wildfire in North Carolina.

N.C.G.S. §15A-300.4 -- No person, entity, or State agency shall use an unmanned aircraft system within either a horizontal distance of 3,000 feet or a vertical distance of 3,000 feet from any forest fire within the jurisdiction of the North Carolina Forest Service.

Remember, wildfires are a nodrone zone for good reason.



lantic hurricane season, which runs from June 1 through November 30, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) predicts above-normal hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin this year. Brunswick County encourages all community members to start preparing now.

For the 2025 Atlantic hurricane season, NOAA is forecasting a range of 13 to 19 total named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher). Of those, 6-10 are forecast to become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3-5 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; with winds of 111 mph or higher). NOAA has a 70% confidence in these ranges.

The alphabetical list of 2025 Atlantic hurricane names can be found at hurricanes.gov/aboutnames.shtm-

Ways to Prepare for Hurricane Season

Make a plan. Create and practice a Family Emergency Communication Plan that includes all members of your household and pets. Discuss who your emergency contacts are, your evacuation route, shelter plan, forms of identification for your pets and animals, how you will receive emergency alerts, where you will store important documents, and what you will put in your emergency supply kit.

Build a kit. An emergency kit is vital for your survival. When preparing an emergency kit, it is recommended to prepare three to seven days-worth of medicine, water, and non-perishable food for each person and pet in your home.

The North Carolina Cooperative Extension - Brunswick County Center has prepared a hurricane cookbook and a Hurricane Meal Kits program to help individuals and families prepare nutritious meals ahead of an emergency.

Stay informed. It's important to plan for multiple ways you will re-

une marked the start of the At-ceive information in the event of a tropical event. Get the latest updates from the National Weather Service in Wilmington (NWS) on their website, social media, or through a NOAA weather radio. Tune in to local news and radio stations, or check your favorite weather app. To get updates from Brunswick County, sign up for the ReadyBrunswick Emergency Notification System, download the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office Mobile App, subscribe to the County's Emergency Updates email list, and follow Brunswick County and the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office on social media.

> Know your evacuation zone. Visit the North Carolina Department of Public Safety's Know Your Zone webpage to view areas most at risk of storm surges and flooding in Brunswick County. Local officials use the zones to determine which areas should be evacuated in case of an emergency. Decide where you would go and what routes you would take if you had to evacuate.

> Know the terms. A Hurricane Watch indicates hurricane conditions are possible. A Hurricane Warning indicates hurricane conditions are expected. Review other related terms used by the National Hurricane Center.

> Check your insurance. Before an emergency strikes, review your insurance policies to ensure your property is covered for any flooding or natural disasters that could occur. Flood insurance, which is not normally part of homeowner's insurance policies, is encouraged for North Carolina residents.

> Find information on emergency planning and hurricane safety online at ReadyNC.gov or Ready.gov. View updates from the National Hurricane Center, a real-time emergency weather map, and additional online resources at nhc.noaa.gov.

New Listings Surge in Brunswick County while Market Remains Competitive

swick County's residential real estate market saw increases in new listings and homes sold in April, while prices decreased. The decrease in prices can be attributed to fewer luxury sales compared to April 2024.

"Our market continued to outpace itself in April, with the largest new listing surge in 2025 AND the largest number of new listings in one month in over a decade," said Cynthia Walsh, CEO of the Brunswick County Association of REALTORS® (BCAR). "Now, you could worry that we might be gaining more listings that we can sell, but when you consider other factors like days on market and the absorption rate, it's clear Brunswick County's market is stable and competitive."

New listings increased 18.1% compared to last April, rising from 747 to 882. The number of homes sold increased 3.4%, from 529 to 547, while total sales volume decreased 9.6%, from \$268,497,854 to \$242,855,771. The average sales price decreased 12.5% from \$507,557 to \$443,978, and the median sales price decreased 9.4% from \$392,000 to \$355,000. Brunswick County's luxury market recorded 23 sales over \$1 million in April 2025, down slightly from the 36 sales over \$1 million recorded in April 2024. The largest sale was a \$4.1 million sale in Ocean Isle Beach. The absorption rate, which is the amount of time it would take to sell off all the current inventory, is 4.6 months.

Year-to-date sales volume through April totaled \$828,735,872, down 1% from \$837,018,297 at the same point in 2024. The average year-to-date sales price decreased 3.8%, from \$484,026 to \$465,497, while the median sales price decreased 3.6%, from \$377,238 to \$363,535. The number of units sold through April is up 4.6% compared to last year, increasing from 1,715 to 1,794, and the number of new listings rose 8.5%, from 2,839 to 3,080.





The Holden Beach Turtle Watch Program



urtle Talk is Family members of all ages will enjoy the program. A turtle patrol volunteer will share their knowledge of nesting sea turtles, what to look for when visiting the beach, and current nest information. There will be a slide show, a delightful short movie, and a Q&A segment. This program focuses on the life cycle of the sea turtle and how the HBTWP aids in the preservation of sea turtles. Several turtle artifacts will be on display. Turtle Talk will be held every Wednesday evening from June 18 to August 13.

Children's Turtle Time is being on Wednesdays at 4:00 p.m. This program is designed for two groups of children, ages 3 – 4 and 5 – 6. An adult should remain with their child during the 45 minute program. If a family has two or more children that fall within both age groups, it is advisable that two adults attend. The program introduces young children to the world of sea turtles through hands-on play, games, books and puzzles. Children's Turtle Time will be held every Wednesday from June 25 to August 6.

Turtle Talk and Children's Turtle Time are free-of-charge and will be held at the Holden Beach Chapel at 107 Rothchild Street on Holden Beach. The 2025 HBTWP tshirt and other HBTWP merchandise will be for sale at both weekly events.

Education & Outreach "Turtle Talk on the Road" - The Hold-

en Beach Turtle Patrol has taken their popular Turtle Talk program on the road so they can bring education about sea turtles directly to you! Members of the Turtle Patrol are available to come to your local classroom, club, community, church or service organization to talk about their organization and provide education and outreach to promote awareness and to advocate for these endangered species. They are available for groups of all ages ... preschool to adults. Contact their outreach program coordinator by email at outreach@hbturtlewatch.org for more information or to schedule a program.

HBTWP was founded in 1989 to monitor and protect the sea turtle population on Holden Beach. This all volunteer, nonprofit conservation organization operates under the authority of the NC Wildlife Resources Commission (ES Permit 25ST11).

The 2025 turtle season began May 1 on Holden Beach when members started patrolling the island each morning looking for signs of a nesting sea turtle crawl on the beach. Sea turtles nest on Holden Beach mid-May through August, and their nests hatch July through October.
