Dosher Hospital Foundation Receives \$25,000 Grant from Louis Bacon's Orton Foundation

Foundation announced that it is the recipient of a \$25,000 grant from the Orton Foundation, the North Carolina affiliate of The Moore Charitable Foundation. The funds will be allocated to Dosher Hospital's Emergency Department, which treats more than 13,000 patients per year and which has earned two national awards for providing high patient satisfaction. Dosher Hospital will use these funds to purchase six Stryker patient transports, three with IV poles and three without IV poles, and ten Mayo bedside procedure stands. The addition of the Stryker transports is needed so that the Emergency Department (ED) staff and physicians have an adequate number of transports to accommodate the number of patients seen. The transports are used to move patients to diagnostic imaging, the patient care ward and other areas of the hospital. The addition of the procedure stands is needed as the current stands are over 20 years old. ED staff and physicians need to have access to stands for performing bedside procedures such as suturing, incision and drainage, etc. The addition of both the transport chairs and

Often the amount of the loan payment is offset by energy savings.

Togetherwesave.com has a list of energy efficiency ideas for you to consider. Eligible projects include new heat pumps with a minimum 15 SEER rating, new electric or solar water heaters, ENERGY STAR replacement windows and doors, insulation of all types, and duct repair or replacement.

If you own your home served by the cooperative, receive a monthly electric bill and have two years of service with a good payment history,



the loan process is simple.

Anchor Initiative id you know the Brunswick transport then to County Sheriff's Office offers many programs for our community? The Anchor Initiative program is one of the most impor-

tant programs we offer.

We have found the three biggest obstacles for those suffering from addiction for not seeking IMMEDI-ATE treatment assistance is lack of knowledge, lack of money and lack of transportation.

How The Program Works:

• Individuals with addictions can contact the Sheriff's Office through self-referral, social referral or officer interaction.

• Once contact is made, the person requesting assistance declares they are addicted and request assistance.

• Participants will not be charged with drugs or paraphernalia found in their possession if socially or self-referred. Participants are not asked where the drugs came from during these encounters. Those encountered by law enforcement while in the criminal element are subject to arrest, however the arrest does not disgualify them from Anchor assistance.

• The individual will be put in immediate contact with an Anchor coordinator, who will respond and do an assessment.

• The coordinator will contact RHA Mobile Crisis or a like entity to start the process of finding availability for detox facilities.

• If the individual is in need of medical treatment, the coordinator will be checked out. Sheriff Brian Chism

During this

process the Anchor Coordinator will be working to find the individual with a treatment option, first seeking inpatient, comprehensive outpatient or intensive outpatient.

 The Anchor coordinator will be working with the volunteer group to provide transportation to and from the ER, Detox and Treatment as needed.

• The Initiative will strive to keep the cost for these individuals as low as possible, paying for the transportation, Detox (if necessary) and initial entrance fees to treatment providers (if necessary).


Even when Austin was a child in Boiling Spring Lakes with a Mickey Mouse Cookbook, he always had a passion for food. He spent time working in restaurants all around the Southport/Oak Island area, growing his knowledge and experience in the restaurant industry. When the opportunity arose for Austin and his sister to move to Hawaii, he jumped at the chance, and it changed his life for the better. Working at one of the top restaurants in Hawaii - a bar and grill similar to his own Koko Cabana, he learned to making everything from scratch. This experience became Austin's "lightbulb" moment. He decided to pursue his dreams of becoming a chef by working 80 hours a week at this restaurant.

"The building for Kai Joe's was up for rent, and it just seemed like the right place at the right time," Austin said when I asked what inspired them to open their first place.

Kai Joe's was the catalyst for their restaurant ownership journey, and once they opened, they did not plan on stopping there. They were full of great ideas, pushing for new opportunities, and approached with great opportunities. Having the commu-

When asked about what inspired them to create such differ-

ent atmospheres and wide-ranging menus, Austin said, "We've [Austin and Alexis] traveled a lot and wanted to bring a different style of food and atmosphere to Southport and Oak Island because it is growing, and people are moving from all over the world. We're always trying to bring new concepts."

And new concepts they bring! From Pacific Rim food to Southern to Spanish, their menus will always provide fun and fresh items you won't find anywhere else in Brunswick County.






