



A Message from Sheriff Brian Chism: Don't **Fall for the Scam Calls**

Brunswick County Residents,

I want to take a moment to personally warn you about a growing issue we're seeing across our county-scam calls targeting good, honest people like vou.

These scammers are clever. They're posing as members of law enforcement, even using real names and spoofing our phone numbers to make their calls look official. One of the most common tricks right now is the jury duty scam. They'll call you and claim you missed jury duty and that there's a warrant out for your arrest. Then they'll demand money to "clear it up."

Let me be very clear:

No one from the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office will ever call you and demand payment over the phone.

We don't ask for gift cards, prepaid debit cards, or anything of the sort. If you actually missed jury duty-or have any other legal issue-you'll be notified properly through the mail, not through a threatening phone call.

These scammers are trying to create panic. They want you to act quickly and emotionally. I want you to do the opposite. Hang up. Take a breath. Then call us directly at (910) 253-2777. We'll tell you the truth.

Here are a few more tips to help protect yourself and your loved ones:

• Never give out personal or financial information over the phone.

- Be suspicious of anyone asking for payment through gift cards, Venmo, or wire transfers.
- Don't click links in random texts or emails claiming unpaid tolls or tax debts.
- If you're unsure—call us. We'd much rather double-check some thing for you than see you get taken advantage of.
- Download the BCSO mobile app and follow us on social media. We put out alerts about scams on a regular basis.

We're also seeing scams involving fake tax notices, toll road messages, online romance cons, and even packages showing up at your door you didn't order. If something feels off, trust your gut.

It's heartbreaking to see people lose their hard-earned money because of these criminals. That's why I'm asking you to help spread the word-talk to your neighbors, your parents, your

As your sheriff, protecting you is my top priority-on the street and online. And we're in this together.







New Hope Clinic's Wellness Wagon and Care-A-Van Greatly Expand **Their Range**

has never wavered in its mission and passion: "To provide patient-centered healthcare and wellness services for underserved adults in Brunswick County."

Over the years they have continu-

ally expanded their services and patient base, and once again they are on the move - but this time, literally.

New Hope Clinic (NHC) recently purchased a 28foot van and transformed it into a clinic on wheels, appropriately called The Wellness Wagon. Then

they bought a minivan and named it Care-a-Van, which is used to screen and enroll the patients. These two new vehicles will allow the clinic to serve low-income, underserved populations that live in locations too far away to travel to the clinic's main facility in Southport.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony to officially inaugurate this new mobile service was held on March 26 and cheered by a crowd of an estimated 75 enthusiastic New Hope supporters and friends. NHC Executive Director Sheila Roberts cut the ribbon and invited the guests to tour the Wellness Wagon and have some refreshments.

The impetus for the Wellness Wagon was a study published by Harvard Medical School in 2018 identifying the pockets of poverty in each state and the need for mobile units to address the situation. The NHC board proposed the mobile health project in 2019, but like so many other programs, it was put on hold during the pandemic and revived in 2023.

For the last two years, NHC has been securing funding for the van and minivan and all the equipment and operating expenses for one year, including insurance and gas.

Major donors included Cape Fear Memorial Foundation, iHeart Catholic Church, Ocean Ridge Charities Association, Southport Ro-

or 27 years New Hope Clinic, tary, The Leon Levine Foundation, Landfall Foundation, Sacred Heart Church, The Catherine Kennedv Home Foundation, St. Phillip's Episcopal Church, Philip L. Van Every Foundation, St. James Service Club, Southport Lions Club and General



Federation of Women's Clubs, plus several individual donors and fundraisers. Collectively they raised a total of \$342,000.

The Wellness Wagon made its maiden run in December of 2024. They now have monthly visits scheduled for St. Brendan's Church in Shallotte and have scheduled visits to The Bridge Presbyterian Church in Leland and the Brunswick County Government Center in Bolivia. Periodically they visit the Christian Recovery Center (CRCI) in Shallotte and its sister facility, Rose House in Calabash.

We are ramping up slowly for the first 90 days," Roberts said. "I'll sleep better after those first 90 days and the van and wagon are fully utilized every day."

Plans include attending community events and health fairs, faith-based communities and other nonprofit organizations that provide human services. The clinic now serves close to 500 patients a year, and the wagon, when fully utilized, will add an additional 200. It is estimated that there are 4,000 people in Brunswick County who meet the eligibility requirements to be treated by New Hope Clinic.

Brunswick County Seeking Volunteers to Form Emergency Response Teams

CERT (Community Emer- into more local teams. gency Response Team) is being organized for Brunswick County and localities. Brunswick County officials are in the initial phase of accepting the first round of volunteers and plan to start formal training during the early summer. After the initial team is formed and trained, application for team certification can be filed with national authorities and the team would be recognized and certified. That initial team can then be broken down

CERT provides trained volunteers to assume support activities during an emergency and free-up highly trained teams such as the fire department during a large event so they can handle the tasks requiring professional training. Membership in CERT is open to any adults 18 years or older. There is no upper age limit.

CERT falls under FEMA, North Carolina Emergency Management, and Brunswick County Emergency sic training and certification include light Search and Rescue, disaster medical triage, distributing disaster supplies, helping with the call center at the county complex, traffic control, and a variety of emergency services. In addition, the trained CERT volunteers will acquire knowledge to help with even personal household or neighbor emergencies.





ets are welcome at all of NC's Brunswick Islands' beaches. In fact, tripswithpets.com named Caswell Beach and Oak Island numbers 1 and 2 respectively in its list of "Top 5 Dog-Friendly Beaches in North Carolina."

Please be aware of any local leash laws or town ordinances listed below that may apply for specific beach locations. Also, please be respectful of others and clean up after your pet.

Bald Head Island - Pets on the beach must be leashed from sunset to sunrise during turtle season, May 1 through November 15. All other times, pets are permitted off leash but must remain under direct supervision at all times.

Caswell Beach - Dogs that are leashed are permitted year round on the beach strand, as long as they do not pose a threat or nuisance to others. Dogs not leashed, but under the control of their owner, are permitted on the beach strand from dawn until 9am year-round. Additionally, from October 15 through March 15, dogs not leashed, but under the control of their owner, are permitted on the beach strand all day.

Holden Beach - Holden Beach does not allow dogs on the beach from May 20th to September 10th between 9am and 5pm. Dogs must be on a leash at all times on the island.

Oak Island - Dogs that are leashed are permitted year round on Oak Island beaches. Dogs are allowed off their leash from October 15 until March 15 from 6am until 8pm in locations marked by beach access signs.

Ocean Isle Beach - Dogs are not permitted on the beach strand between the hours of 9am and 6pm during the period of Memorial Day through Labor Day. Dogs must be on a leash at all times on the island when off the premises of the owner, keeper. or guardian.

Sunset Beach - From the Friday preceding Memorial Day through Labor Day, dogs are not allowed on the beach between the hours of 8am and 6pm After 6pm. and before 8am, dogs are allowed on a leash no longer than 10 feet. After Labor Day and before the Friday preceding Memorial Day, dogs are allowed all day but must be leashed.

Just remember, whenever you're on the beach with your dog regardless of location, please be respectful of others and the environment, and clean up after your pet.

ow Speed Vehicles are registered through the State of North Carolina and DO NOT require a special permit or authorization to operate within the Town limits.

Many retailers sell specifically designed LSVs, or in some cases golf carts which have been redesigned to meet the requirements of an LSV. In many cases these retailers will provide the needed registration and titling services required to make a vehicle "street legal" in North Caro-

For vehicles sold from the factory as a Low Speed Vehicle with proper safety equipment, registration, tags & title, no further action is needed.

By North Carolina law it is required for LSEV's:

- To be driven on public streets (no sidewalks)
- All operators must possess a valid driver's license
- The vehicle must be registered with the North Carolina Depart ment of Motor Vehicles and have a valid license tag, vehicle inspection and valid vehicle insurance

LSEV's fall under the following Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard. No. 500 (49 CFR 571.500) which states:

- Must have the ability to travel between 20-25 mph
- Be equipped with headlamps
- Be equipped with stop lamps
- Be equipped with turn signal lamps
- Be equipped with tail lamps
- Be equipped with reflex reflectors
- Be equipped with parking brakes
- Be equipped with rearview mirrors
- Be equipped with windshields
- Be equipped with seat belts
- Be equipped with vehicle identification numbers (VIN)

If you are bringing a Low Speed Electric Vehicle (Golf Cart) from out of state your LSEV must:

- Be registered with your state of residence Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)
- Must have a license tag (hard tag just like your car) issued by your
- Must have valid insurance Check your particular town for further rules of the road regarding low speed vehicles.



Ride with Brunswick Transit System



runswick Transit System, Inc. (BTS) is a non-profit community transportation system that coordinates general public and human services transportation for the residents of Brunswick County. The transit system operates a fleet of 17 vehicles, including ADA equipped vehicles to assist persons with special needs.

What services does BTS offer?

BTS provides non-emergency transportation services to the general public through our Dial-a-Ride grant funded program and to various agency clients through contracts with those respective agencies.

What is Dial-a-Ride?

Dial-a-ride is a fare assistance transportation program sponsored by the North Carolina Department of Transportation. The service is open to the residents of Brunswick County. There is a fare and reservations are required. Reservations must be made at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance. Transportation is available on a first-come/first-serve basis as space and schedules permit.

Who can ride?

Any resident of Brunswick County is eligible to ride with BTS. BTS provides transportation for general purpose trips, medical trips, and most non-emergency trip destinations.

When can I ride?

Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:30pm as space permits. When you make your reservation please allow 2 hours for service before your requested dropoff as pick-up times may vary depending on the number of riders. Once a reservation is confirmed you will receive an automated phone call including a pick-up time. A driver may only wait five (5) minutes for you to

board the van.

How do I schedule a ride?

To request general public transportation services, call the BTS office at (910) 253-7800 or toll-free at 877-754-2764 between the hours of 8am and 4:30pm, Monday-Friday. Requests left with the answering service are not scheduled until our staff has contacted you.

What information do I need?

You will need to provide the dispatcher/scheduler with the following information when you call to schedule your trip: Your name, address, destination address, telephone number, any return trip information, any special requirements (space needed for a child seat, wheel chair, etc.), and the name, relationship, and age of anyone traveling with you.

How do I cancel a ride?

If you must cancel a scheduled trip please notify the BTS office at 910-253-7800 or toll-free at 877-754-2764 as soon as possible, but at least 2 hours in advance of your pick-up time. Early notification allows BTS to provide transportation to others and will eliminate any no-show charges, which must be paid before future rides are scheduled.

How much does it cost?

Fares for general public riders are \$3.00 or \$5.00 one-way depending on the destination. When you call the dispatcher/scheduler you will be given the correct fare for your scheduled trip. Tickets can be purchased from the BTS office. Arrangements can be made by calling the BTS office at 910-253-7800 or toll-free at 877-754-2764.
