Southport Awarded \$70,000 Grant from NCDEQ

he City of Southport has been awarded a \$70,000 grant from the NC Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) through the Resilient Coastal Communities Program (RCCP).

This funding will help Southport identify and prioritize local projects that improve our community's ability to handle coastal challenges like flooding, stormwater issues, and other infrastructure concerns.

The grant fully covers the first two phases of the RCCP program, which include:

- Address local barriers to coastal resilience, including limited staffing capacity, financial constraints, and social inequities
- Support communities in conducting risk and vulnerability assessments to create a prioritized list of resilience-focused projects.

The State will select, compensate, and oversee consultants to assess Southport's vulnerabilities and recommend potential projects tailored to the city's needs. Once the first two phases are complete, Southport will be eligible to apply for additional funding under Phases 3 and 4 to support the design and implementation of the recommended projects.

The program is administered by the North Carolina Division of Coastal Management (DCM) with funding support from the NC General Assembly and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF). Key partners include the NC Office of Recovery and Resiliency (NCORR), The Nature Conservancy (TNC), and NC Sea Grant (NCSG).







Oak Island Awarded NCDEQ Grant

in coastal resiliency grants to 32 communities for planning, engineering, design, and construction. The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality announced nearly \$6 million in coastal resiliency grants to 32 communities for planning, engineering, design, and construction. The Town of Oak Island is one of the grant recipients, and will be awarded \$70,000 as part of the NC Resilient Coastal Communities Program (RCCP).

The main deliverable for Phases 1 and 2 is a Resiliance Strategy, which includes a Project Portfolio of pro-

tate awards nearly \$6 million jects that address the community's specific coastal resilience needs. The Resilience Strategy provides a strong foundation than can later inform a full Resilience Plan be integrated into existing local plans and ordinances. Having a document like this helps communities clarify their goals, attract funding, and pave a more direct path to implementation.

> Once Phase 1 and 2 are complete, the Town can then apply for future funding through RCCP for engineering and designs (Phase 3) and implementation (Phase 4) for projects identified in our project portfolio.

Oak Island Launches Adopt-A-Tree Program

uring the Town Council meeting last week, Stormwater Administrator and Tree Canopy Manager, Brice Taylor officially announced the launch of the Town's new Adopt-A-Tree program.

This new program helps to advance the goals of increasing the tree canopy and improving the survivability of newly planted live oaks in the Right Of Way (ROW). Participants can "adopt" a recently planted live oak tree, either through a one-time donation as a TREE PROVIDER or as a TREE MANAGER, agreeing to a 24-month commitment to water the adopted tree.

In addition to helping the Town

through the many benefits provided by live oak trees, participants will also have their tree's name listed in the Tree Adoption Registry, with background information included in an Online Story Map. Brunswick County Emergency Management urges all residents to sign up for the ReadyBrunswick Emergency Notification System. This free service allows the county to reach thousands of people in seconds with urgent weather alerts, safety notices, and emergency information.

It only takes a minute to enroll: Sign uponline at <u>brunswickcountync.</u> gov/833/Emergency-Alerts or text BRUNSWICK to 888777.

Once registered, you can tailor alerts by location, language, and quiet hours using the online portal. Keeping your contact info up to date is key—this service only works if we can reach you.

Make a Plan

Create a Family Emergency Plan that covers evacuation routes, shelter options, pet care, important documents, and how your household will stay in touch during an emergency.

Build a Kit

Prepare 3–7 days' worth of non-perishable food, water, and medications for each person and pet in your home.

Know Your Zone

Check your evacuation zone at ncdps.gov/KnowYourZone to find out if you live in a high-risk area for storm surge or flooding.

Understand the Terms

A Hurricane Watch means conditions are possible. A Hurricane Warning means they are expected. Learn the difference so you can respond appropriately.

Review Your Insurance

Make sure your property insurance is up to date—and consider flood insurance, which is not typically included in homeowner policies.


emergency shelter placement, referrals, and other services across a three-county region-all with a trauma-informed care approach.
