



For a winter treat, Koko Cabana, on Oak Island, is offering 1/2 price appetizers from 2pm-4pm daily.


Sorry to say, Seabreeze Restaurant in Ocean Isle Beach closed its doors on December 31.

Brunswick County is Seeking Volunteers to Form Community Emergency Response Teams

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is being organized for Brunswick County and localities. Brunswick County officials are in the initial phase of accepting the first round of volunteers and plan to start formal training during the early summer. After the initial team is formed and trained, application for team certification can be filed with national authorities and the team would be recognized and certified. That initial team can then be broken down into more local teams.

CERT provides trained volunteers to assume support activities during an emergency and free-up highly trained teams such as the fire department during a large event so they can handle the tasks requiring professional training. Membership in CERT is open to any adults 18 years or older. There is no upper age limit.

CERT falls under FEMA, North Carolina Emergency Management, and Brunswick County Emergency Management. CERT volunteer basic training and certification include light Search and Rescue, disaster

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is besing organized for Brunswick and localities. Brunswick officials are in the initial faccepting the first round of ears and plan to start formal during the early summer. medical triage, distributing disaster supplies, helping with the call center at the county complex, traffic control, and a variety of emergency services. In addition, the trained CERT volunteers will acquire knowledge to help with even personal household or neighbor emergencies.

Additional task forces under Brunswick CERT are planned to be Advanced Technical Search and Rescue and the REVC (Radiation Emergency Volunteer Corps) which falls under the DHHS Medical Reserve Corps and NC State CERT and would provide triage, decontamination, and other services in the event of a radiation event at one the three reactors in North Carolina.

Dosher Drug Drop Reports Turnout of 250 Households

2 50 households discarded 5,696 expired or unwanted narcotic pills and 830.3 milliliters of narcotic liquids at Dosher Memorial Hospital's 27th semiannual Operation Medicine Cabinet, held on Tuesday, December 3rd. Medications collected were sorted and then transported from the hospital grounds for safe incineration.

The event had been rescheduled from its original date in October, due to the road closures and detours from damages caused by the September storm known as Potential Tropical Cyclone #8. Said Dosher President and CEO Lynda Stanley. "We thank our local residents for their patience in waiting for the new date and are grateful for everyone who made the effort to empty their medicine cabinets. Proper disposal of unwanted medications saves lives."

In addition to Dosher employees, staff and volunteers from the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department, members of the Brunswick Wellness Coalition, and Coastal Horizons, were onsite to assist and to provide law enforcement. "This event takes a lot of onsite support, and we appreci-

ate the staff and community partners who collected and sorted medication in order to make our community safer," said Stanley.

Operation Medicine Cabinet has become a much-anticipated community event. The next collection of unwanted prescription medication will be scheduled for April, 2025. Check the event calendar at Dosher.org for date and time.



Fighting Food Insecurity in Brunswick County

ood insecurity is a defined reality for hundreds of thousands of Americans who cannot keep food on the table. Food banks work every day to nourish people while building solutions to hunger through programming and partnerships, empowering North Carolina communities to thrive.

Brunswick County Population - 137,000

People who are food insecure - 18,000 (13%)

Children under 18 who are food insecure – 3,900 (19%)

People over 65 living below the poverty line – 7,500

Children receiving free/reduced school meals – 1,200 (90%)

Unemployed - (June 2022) 8.5%

To ensure Brunswick County schools and care resources can meet demands, PORCH South Brunswick coordinates monthly neighborhood food drives in 34+ communities across southern Brunswick County. Brunswick County is a vast 1,050 square miles in size. If you live in the Leland area and are interesting in participating or finding out more about a local PORCH program you can contact the PORCH North Brunswick chapter here who also coordinates monthly food drives.

How Porch Works

PORCH is a very simple neighborhood food drive. Here's how it works:

Once a month, during a designated week, participants place grocery items on their front porch

Volunteers pickup these bags and deliver them to local food pantries

At the pantry volunteers weigh and sort the food items collected and place them into categories

That's it! The three-step process is easy, fast and safe.

The best items to donate during the food drive have not expired, are non-perishable and are not in glass packaging. We even provide suggestions for items we could use most each month. Email us or check our Facebook Page and we'll connect you to a community lead in your area. We can also point you to the closest drop-off location each month.



Southport Forestry Committee Inviting Suggestions for Placing the New 2025 Trees

ach January the Forestry Com- have been added to the City's urban mittee partners with the Public WorksDepartment to plant nearly a dozen new trees as part of the City's annual reforestation program. This year, the Forestry Committee is inviting local citizens to suggest possible sites where the January 2025 trees might be planted.

Recommendations for possible placement of this year's new trees must meet several requirements. First and foremost, the trees can be planted only in the City's rights-of-way or parks, not on private property. Priority is often given to places where there are gaps in the existing canopy. Sometimes existing trees have died or been destroyed by storms. Perhaps past construction projects or City infrastructure projects required the removal of trees. Replacing these lost trees is high on the list of potential

As you walk or drive around town, you will notice that nestled in and among the stately old live oaks are trees of varying sizes. What you are seeing is the result of 25+ years of reforestation since the program began in 1998. To date, over 400 new trees

forest. While live oaks comprise the preponderance of new trees, the Committee also introduces species diversity to protect against devastating loss due to infestation or disease.

Funding for the new trees comes from several sources. Each year, the Neisler Foundation donates to the program in memory of Betty Timberlake, a founding member and past chair of the Forestry Committee. Over the years, various service organizations and individual citizens have also made gifts to the City for the purchase of trees.

Once the trees are in place, the Public Works Department handles weekly watering until the trees are established. Homeowners will sometimes "adopt" trees in the rights-ofway in front of their homes and handle the weekly watering.





New Location for Sea Biscuit Wildlife Shelter!

50 Birds were the first rescues cared for in 2007 when Mary Ellen Rogers started Sea Biscuit Wildlife Shelter. The first floor of her home and her backyard were the emergency care center, feeding station, and protected environment while recovering from various injuries or illnesses. Forward to 2024, the entire backyard is filled with enclosures, the emergency and care facilities are dealing with maximum capacity.

In 2024 Sea Biscuit has cared for 1,107 birds as of November 20. Sea birds, raptors, song birds ... all have come our way. The need for more room became apparent a while ago. The team tried to develop raw land leased to us by Duke Energy, but the costs involved were too great for our shelter relying entirely on donations.

Fortunately, once the decision was made to look elsewhere for a new facility, Francesca Slaughter, came to our rescue. Finding a place close to the ocean, with a big backyard, a lot big enough to house the enclosures, close to our existing facility so our volunteers could have easy access, and a place for people to visit us were just a few of our requirements. Within just a few weeks after given the guidelines, Francesca found 4260 Long Beach Road. Our beautiful new logo/sign is now out front,

The efforts to bring this up to our mandated wildlife requirements a currently underway. A new "barn" and pelican pool which would house all of the outside birds is being finalized and will be erected as soon as



possible. Moving 17 years' worth of equipment, indoor enclosures, freezers, paperwork, etc. will be done as soon as the enclosures are complete.

In January we will invite all our wonderful supporters to a grand opening/open house to show off the wonderful new facility.

We hope you will be there!



Brunswick County Bridge Construction Requires Temporary Closure

s part of the N.C. 211 widening project underway in Brunswick County, a portion of NC 133 (Long Beach Road) closed to thru traffic.

The road near Southport-Supply Road closed mid-November and is slated to reopen by fall 2025 while an NC Department of Transportation contractor makes several improvements, including the construction of a bridge over NC 211.

Drivers needing to get around the construction will be detoured onto Old Long Beach Road. Drivers should be alert to the new traffic pattern and slowdown in the area.

This project was originally scheduled to begin in mid-September but was postponed due to severe weather that impacted the area.

Brunswick County Real Estate Market Remains Strong Heading Into Winter



runswick County's residential real estate market remained strong through October and November, with year-to-date sales volume surpassing \$2.5 billion and continuing to track ahead of last year's pace. In addition to strong sales, inventory increased, reaching levels not seen in several years.

"While rising inventory might be a warning sign of a slowing market in other areas, that's not the case in Brunswick County." said Cynthia Walsh, CEO of the Brunswick County Association of RE-ALTORS[®]. "Home sales have been steady all year, in part because Brunswick County continues to be one of the fastest-growing counties in the state and nation. The increased supply is needed to meet the continued strong demand."

In November, new listings increased 9.7% compared to last year, from 505 to 554. The number of units sold rose 6%, from 401 to 425. Average sale prices increased slightly by 1.1%, rising from \$486,919 to \$492,324. Median sale prices also grew 2.5%, increasing from \$365,000 to \$374,000. Meanwhile, total sales volume jumped 7.2%, climbing from \$195,254,439 to \$209,237,493. The luxury market remained strong in November, with 31 sales of \$1 million or more. The largest transaction over the past two months occurred in Ocean Isle Beach and topped \$4 million.

Year-to-date sales volume through November totaled \$2,347,027,519, up 7.7% from \$2,528,195,704 at the same point in 2023. The average year-to-date sale price increased 3.2%, from \$464,313 to \$479,328, while the median sales price increased 0.5%, from \$373,859 to \$375,570. The number of units sold through





Oak Island Paid Parking Update

uring their meeting on December 10, the Town Council decided on some important updates for the 2025 Paid Parking Season. Most notably, there will be NO rate changes for Temporary Parking in 2025, and rates will REMAIN the same for both residents and visitors alike. Similarly, the Season Dates were NOT extended through October, and will REMAIN at April 1 - September 30. The Resident Parking spaces will be continue to be enforced by Otto Connect staff from until 9:00 PM daily, but now at a reduced cost thanks to stronger revenues than previously anticipated.

As for the Seasonal Parking Permits, a total sales limit has NOT been established for 2025 yet, and will be determined during at a later date, but before the start of the 2025 Parking Season. It is important to note, that any potential increase in the total sales of Season Parking Permits could be offset by eliminating the Bulk Permit option that was available to vehicle rental businesses in 2024.

Practicing Winter Weather Safety

s our region begins to experience colder temperatures, Brunswick County encourages community members to start their winter preparedness efforts. Whether you are a longtime resident or visiting the area, these tips can help keep you safe during the colder months.

Stay Informed

Register for the ReadyBrunswick emergency notification system: https://member.everbridge.net/311440963535093/new

Remain alert for updates from the National Weather Service Forecast Office in Wilmington, NC (NWS-Wilmington) at weather.gov/ ilm. You can find the latest weather briefing at weather.gov/ilm/briefing and winter weather information at weather.gov/ilm/winter.

Have multiple ways to get weather information (local news and radio stations, NOAA weather radios, National Weather Service, emergency alert notifications, etc.)

Know how to report power outages and downed electrical lines to your electric provider. Visit their websites to learn how to report these hazards to Duke Energy Progress or Brunswick Electric Membership Corporation (BEMC).

Fire Prevention & Heat Safety Tips

Most deaths that occur during winter storms are not a direct result of the weather. Instead, people die from home fires and carbon monoxide poisoning while using alternate ways to heat or power their home. Take time to safeguard your home against these dangers and ensure the well-being of your family, pets, and property.

Check your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. The Brunswick County Fire Marshal's Office offers a Free Smoke Alarm Installation Program and a Free Carbon Monoxide Detector Installation Program to Brunswick County employees, residents, and property owners. Visit the Community Risk Reduction webpage to learn more.

Always plug space heaters directly into wall outlets, and make sure the cords and plugs aren't damaged or frayed. DON'T use an extension cord or power strip.

Place space heaters on a solid, flat surface and keep them at least three feet from other items. Turn them off when leaving the room or sleeping.

NEVER use a stove, oven, or charcoal grill to heat your home.

Operate generators outdoors, away from doors and windows to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.

Keep all heat sources—including fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, portable heaters, or candles—at least three feet away from anything that can burn.

Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected each year by a professional

Protect Water Systems from Freezing Temperatures

Your pipes are at risk of freezing any time temperatures drop below 32°F or 0°C. Prevent costly pipe damage this winter by taking precautions to protect household and irrigation water systems from freezing.

Insulate pipes in unheated areas of your home and crawl spaces.

Seal any gaps and cracks in your home's exterior (such as crawl spaces) to prevent cold drafts from reaching your pipes.

Disconnect water hoses from outdoor spigots and turn off irrigation systems

Open doors to cabinets below your sinks to help warmer air circulate around plumbing at night.

Allow a small amount of water to drip from your faucets. Running water, even at a trickle, helps prevent pipes from freezing.

Always be aware of the main water shut-off valve location for your home in case you should experience a burst pipe and need to turn off your water. Contact Brunswick County Public Utilities or your local water provider if you need assistance.


