



# Holiday Homes Tour Returns to Southport December 13



Tour of Homes returns for its 34th year on Saturday, December 13, 2025, from 11:00am to 5:00pm. Presented by the Southport Historical Society (SHS) and Downtown Southport Inc. (DSI), the event remains a cornerstone of the city's annual Winterfest celebration.

SHS President Liz Fuller shared her excitement about the partnership, saying, "The SHS board of directors and Holiday Tour of Homes committee members are excited to welcome DSI as a partner for the first time this year. We feel the missions of our organizations are a perfect fit to continue to expand upon the value the Tour brings to our community."

More than 100 volunteers will help coordinate and host the tour, welcoming guests into nine homes and one church throughout Southport. Each stop features a unique story, design, and holiday décor, with volunteer docents on hand to share the history and special touches that make each home shine.

"It's a great mix of historic, restored, and newly constructed homes," said DSI President Randy Jones. "They're also conveniently clustered, making it easy for visitors to get around. For many families, this has become an annual tradition—enjoying local shops and restaurants, then touring the homes and wrapping up the day with other Winterfest events, including the annual Flotilla."

Due to the tour's popularity, only 1,000 tickets will be available this year. Tickets go on sale to the public on November 19, 2025, and can be purchased exclusively online at www.southporthistoricalsociety.org for \$30 each, with a limit of four tickets per purchase. Southport Historical Society members as of September 30, 2025, will receive an opportunity to buy advance tickets via email.

This year's Holiday Tour of Homes promises another festive showcase of community spirit, architecture, and holiday tradition—an event not to be missed in Southport's charming coastal setting.

#### Brunswick County Real Estate Hits Record \$325 Million in August Sales

runswick County's housing market hit a new high in August 2025, recording more than \$325 million in total sales – the strongest month of the year and one of the biggest in county history.

"August was nothing short of historic for Brunswick County's real estate market," said Cynthia Walsh, CEO of the Brunswick County Association of REALTORS® (BCAR). "We recorded more than \$325 million in sales for the month, including 57 sales of \$1 million or more and a \$4.8 million transaction on Bald Head Island. Those big-ticket deals helped push us past \$2 billion in sales for the year, a milestone that would have been unthinkable just five years ago."

According to BCAR's monthly report, new listings rose 23.3% compared to August 2024, climbing from 666 to 821. The number of homes sold increased 15.2%, from 539 to 621, with 38% of those

sales being new construction. Total sales volume jumped 23.2%, from \$263.8 million to \$325 million.

The average sales price rose 6.9% to \$523,391, while the median price grew 2% to \$392,082. The county's luxury market played a major role in the record-setting month, with 57 sales over \$1 million — including a \$4.8 million Bald Head Island property and two \$3.5 million homes in Ocean Isle Beach.

As homes continued to move quickly, the absorption rate dipped below five months, and average days on market remained steady at just over two months.

Through the end of August, year-to-date sales reached \$2.01 billion – up 7.6% from \$1.87 billion during the same period in 2024. The number of homes sold rose 6.8%, from 3,913 to 4,180, and new listings climbed 12.2%, from 5,601 to 6,284. The average sales price is up slightly at \$481,618, while the median price held steady at \$375,400.

While Brunswick County continues to lead the region, nearby counties saw more modest results.

Bladen County: 10 homes sold, down 9.1% year-over-year, with an average price of \$208,390.

Columbus County: 25 homes sold, down 16.7%, with an average price of \$239,316.

Robeson County: 5 homes sold, up 66.7%, though the average price fell to \$107,000.

# **Holden Beach Turtle Patrol Bids Farewell to Longtime Leaders**



he 2025 sea turtle season closed on a heartfelt note for the Holden Beach Turtle Patrol as members gathered to honor Pat and Alice Cusack — two dedicated volunteers who have been the heart of the organization for nearly two decades.

Alice joined the patrol in 2006 and has completed 20 sea turtle seasons. From her first year, she took on added responsibilities and quickly became a key leader within the organization. Over the years, she mentored and trained more than 100 members while serving in numerous roles including Morning Caller, Head of Stranding, Assistant Coordinator, T-Shirt Co-Coordinator, and volunteer with the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital for five years. Known for her kindness, leadership, and passion for sea turtles, Alice's presence on the beach and in the community made a lasting impact.

Pat joined the following year, in 2007, and went on to serve 19 sea turtle seasons. He was an active member from the beginning, taking on roles such as ATV Coordinator, Assistant Coordinator, and eventually Permit Holder and Program Coordinator in 2014. Like Alice, Pat volunteered weekly at the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital and shared his time mentoring new members. Fellow volunteers often noted that he could be found on the beach even when he wasn't scheduled-always working, teaching, or lending a hand.

When asked what they will miss most, the Cusacks said it will be their friends on the Turtle Patrol, the joy of talking to the public, and the unforgettable experience of watching sea turtles nest and hatch.

During the Turtle Patrol's endof-season celebration, Mayor Alan Holden and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission sea turtle biologist Matthew Godfrey attended to help honor the couple. Both Pat and Alice were named Honorary Members of the Holden Beach Turtle Patrol — a distinction reserved for those who have demonstrated extraordinary service and made significant contributions to the program.

"The Cusacks have shaped this organization in so many ways," said members of the patrol. "Their dedication and leadership have inspired generations of volunteers."

As they step away from their active roles, the Cusacks leave behind a strong, compassionate team ready to continue their legacy. Steve McNeill, who shadowed Pat this season, will take over as Program Coordinator. Pat expressed full confidence in his successor, describing McNeill as "smart, calm, and organized."

Though they'll be missed on the sand, Pat and Alice Cusack's influence will continue to guide the Holden Beach Turtle Patrol for years to come.
