



eat the Peak alerts let our members know when it's a good time to voluntarily limit energy usage. BEMC sends these alerts to prepare members for times of peak demand, which are generally cold winter mornings and hot summer afternoons. Although our system has plenty of capacity to handle demand, we send these alerts because the rate we pay for wholesale power is based on the highest hour of peak demand for that month. By decreasing electricity use during an alert, we have the power to collectively reduce our wholesale power rate by lowering that peak.

Keeping peak demand as low as possible also helps us avoid needing more capacity. If we can work together to reduce peak demand, we can avoid, or delay, expensive upgrades

to our infrastructure and the building of new power generating plants. Lowering peak demand can help us delay or reduce rate increases.

Members who participate during Beat the Peak alerts do things like adjusting their thermostats a few degrees and avoiding using large appliances. But even turning off just one light bulb can help. If you're not receiving Beat the Peak alerts and would like to, please call (800) 842-5871. #### **Boiling Spring Lakes Receives \$14-million for Dam**

oiling Spring Lakes publicly received state funding of \$14 million during the Dec. 7 Commissioners meeting for the dam restoration project. The state approved the funding Nov. 19.

"Probably the best news we had in years," City Manager David Andrews said, mindful of the destruction caused by Hurricane Florence in September 2018.

"I want to make sure that we all know how important it was and how much gratitude that we owe to Senator (Bill) Rabon as well as Rep. Charlie Miller," Andrews said. He also noted funding source to fill that \$12 million will be awarded a construction constate Rep. Frank Iler's aid.

"I have to say that meant everything to the city," Andrews said about the legislators' efforts. "We would be devastated without that."

The dam restoration is projected to cost \$43.6 million: \$14 million from the state; \$17.6 million from the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and \$12 million to be raised by the

"We're going to work over the next months to see if we can find another hole," Andrews said.

A workshop is set for 6 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 11, at City Hall to give the public up-to-date information.

The environmental assessment is due to be completed by June, according to Andrews' latest timeline.

Construction bids are expected to be received by December 2022 and construction is expected to be completed by February 2026, with water impoundment to follow.

#### Brunswick County's Real Estate Market Sees Higher Prices, **Increased Sales Volume and Tight Inventory in November**

runswick County's residential real estate market saw higher prices, higher sales volume and a tight inventory of available homes in November. The market remains ahead of 2020's record pace in terms of total sales volume for the year. While the number of units sold in November was down slightly, total sales volume increased 10.2% compared to 2020, and new listings were down 13.5%.

"Our market has been amazingly resilient throughout 2021," said BCAR CEO Cynthia Walsh. "We continue to see strong demand and a tight inventory, which results in homes selling quickly and at higher prices. In addition, a strong luxury home market continues to fuel our higher average sale price. The bottom line is that our market is in good shape as 2021 comes to a close."

Brunswick County \$205,540,000 in total sales volume in November 2021, a 10.2% increase from last November's \$186,450,000. New listings dropped 13.5%, from 547 to 473, and the number of units **Brunswick County** sold decreased 5.6%, from 533 to 503. The market saw a net increase of 30 new listings, which reflects the difference between units sold and new listings. The average sales price increased 16.8%, from \$349,811 to \$408,628, and was fueled in part by luxury home sales. November saw 19 sales in excess of \$1 million, with the highest being a \$2.4 million transaction. The average number of days on the market is down slightly at 27 days, with a median of nine days.

Overall, Brunswick County's vear-to-date numbers are still ahead of 2020's pace. Total sales volume is up 27.5% compared to the same point in 2020, increasing from \$1,930,013,000 to \$2,461,099,429. Average sales prices for the year are up 19.4%, from \$330,840 in 2020 to \$395,059 in 2021. The number of units sold through November is up 9.1%, from 5,708 to 6,226. The number of new listings for the year saw a slight 2.8% increase, from 6,607 to 6,789.




