to the 120th Infantry 30th Infantry Division Company K. During the last strong push of the German Army called the Battle of the Bulge, in a town called Malmédy, company

K was fighting German forces and receiving friendly fire from medium bombers on December 23rd, 24th, 25th and 27th.

Chapman was declared Missing in Action/ Killed in Action on 25, December 1944. His final resting place will never be known but he is memorized in The Ardennes Amer-

ican National Cemetery in Belgium along with 5162 Americans and 463 Missing in Action.

Chapman gave the ultimate sacrifice long ago, but we have countless servicemen and women standing guard to do the same if needed. Please say a prayer and give thanks for those

that stand between us and the evils of this world.

#### **New Hope Clinic Provides Healthcare to Low or No Income Adults**

he New Hope Clinic is a nonprofit health care clinic that provides free, comprehensive primary care to uninsured adults who are 18 and older with low or no income. Their staff includes six paid professionals as well as 150 volunteers, offering medical care, dental care, pharmacy services, and health education. They also connect patients to care with specialists, mental health professionals, and for necessary testing. The staff is dedicated to building a healthy community in

Brunswick County.

New Hope Clinic was established in Brunswick County over 20 years ago, because the health care needs in our community are so great. Approximately 11% of the people in our county are uninsured or underinsured. The Clinic serves close to 1,000 adults each year, who make up less than 10% of the people in Brunswick County who qualify for our services. The greatest challenge is to get the word out about their services to those in need before they have a

health emergency.

The main clinic is located in Boiling Spring Lakes off of Highway 87 and there is a satellite clinic located in Shallotte with Brunswick Family Assistance. New Hope serves Brunswick County adults who qualify. Stop in to the Clinic, visit thed website (www.newhopeclinicfree.org) or learn more by calling (910) 845-5333. Our staff works with each person to help them identify if they qualify for our services and to find a different clinic if they do not.





#### **Project Lifesaver Program**

s we embark on a new year, it's always important to remind our community about and request the various programs the Sheriff's Office has to offer.

The Project Lifesaver program is one of the most important programs offered to our citizens. Our community is growing and a great many of the folks moving into our are seniors. Project Lifesaver is a FREE service for Brunswick County residents who are caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's disease, autism or other conditions that make them likely to wander away from caregivers, or who have difficulties communicating with rescuers. Project Lifesaver bracelets, which are provided at no cost, help first responders loved ones who have wandered away. This program gives care givers peace of mind.

In order to participate in the Project Lifesaver Program, the prospective client must meet all of the following requirements:

- Live within Brunswick County.
- Be diagnosed by a certified physician as having Alzheimer's disease, other dementia disorders, autism, Down's syndrome or similar disorders.
- Be known to wander away from caregiver.

Project Lifesaver is funded solely through donations and once again is free to Brunswick County residents. More information can be found on our website: https://www. brunswicksheriff.com/commun.../ project-lifesaver

Another extremely important program we offer is the Anchor Initiative Program. We have found, through experience and research, the three biggest obstacles for those suffering from addiction not seeking IMMEDIATE treatment assistance has been lack of knowledge, money and transportation.

Individuals with addictions can contact the Sheriff's Office through self-referral, social referral or officer interaction. Once contact is made, the person requesting assistance deare addicted assistance. **Participants** will not be charged with drugs or para-

phernalia found in their possession if socially or self-referred.

Participants are not asked where the drugs came from during these encounters. Those encountered by law enforcement while in the criminal element are subject to arrest, however the arrest does not disqualify them from Anchor assistance. The individual will be put in immediate contact with an Anchor coordinator, who will respond and do an assessment. The coordinator will contact RHA Mobile Crisis or a like entity to start the process of finding availability for detox facilities. If the individual is in need of medical treatment, the coordinator will transport them to the local ER to be checked out. During this process, the Anchor Coordinator will work to find the individual a treatment option; first seeking inpatient, comprehensive outpatient or intensive outpatient care. The Anchor coordinator will be working with the volunteer group to provide transportation to and from the ER, Detox and Treatment as needed. The Initiative will strive to keep the cost for these individuals as low as possible, paying for the transportation, Detox (if necessary) and initial entrance fees to treatment providers (if necessary). The Anchor Initiative Program is funded through donations to the Brunswick Sheriff's Charitable Foundation.

The Sheriff's Office offers many other programs and resources to the community including Citizens' Academy, Rape Aggression and Defense (R.A.D.), Are You Okay - just to name a few. ## **New Shopping Center Coming to Leland**

Site plans recently submitted to the town by a Georgia-based developer and engineer outline "The Shoppes At Savannah Branch,"

This site along U.S. 17 across from Brunswick Forest in Leland could be home to a grocery store and other retail businesses.

Included in the plans to develop the 16.7 acres are 10 store fronts, including a nearly 48,000 square-foot

n the works is a 17-acre shopping unnamed grocery store. Parking is Plaza. Let's go Brunswick County! also included on the site.

Jessica Jewell, communications manager for Leland, said these plans are currently being reviewed by the town's technical review committee.

The committee will provide comments on the project, which must be addressed by the developer, if necessary, before the project moves forward in the approval process.

Development is booming in Leland, notably in the U.S. 17 area. Brunswick Beer & Cider on South Dickinson Drive opened last month, and a Lowe's Home Improvement is on its way to the corner of Ocean Gate Plaza and Gateway Boulevard.

The grocery store, which has not yet been named, would be one of at least six in the town – including nearby Lowes Foods, Harris Teeter and Aldi; as well as Village Road's Piggly Wiggly and Food Lion.

#### **North Carolina New Year's Eve Drops**

n New Year's Eve, many localities in America mark the beginning of a year through the raising or lowering of an object. Many of these events are patterned off festivities that have been held at New York City's Times Square since 1908, where a large crystal ball is lowered down a pole atop One Times Square (beginning its descent at 11:59:00 p.m. local time, and concluding at midnight). In turn, the event was inspired by the time balls used by ship navigators in the 19th century to calibrate their chronometers.

Whilst some of these events use a ball in imitation of Times Square, many "drops" utilize objects that represent an aspect of local culture, geography, or history. Ball drops are by far the most common in, but not exclusive to, the United States.

Here are notable drops from North Carolina:

**Beaufort, North Carolina:** A pirate is dropped.

Black Creek, North Carolina: A large red heart drop represents "A Small Town with a Big Heart".

Brasstown, North Carolina: A plexiglass pyramid containing a living opossum is lowered from the roof of Clay Logan's convenience store for The Possum Drop. The possum is turned loose at the end of the celebration. Despite these measures, the event has been met with criticism from animal rights activists, particularly PETA, who has a history of objections to the event. The event resumed in 2014. After PETA protests, organizers announced in January 2018 they would be stepping down and retiring from organizing the event, saving that "it's a hard job to do" and "it's time to move on."

Burgaw, North Carolina: A blueberry drops in reference to the town's annual blueberry festival.

Eastover, North Carolina: A

three-foot tall, thirty-pound wooden flea is dropped.

Charlotte, North Carolina: A lighted crown is raised, representing Charlotte's nickname as "The Queen City". Charlotte Center City Partners produces the festivities.

Greenville: Emerald Drop

Harkers Island: Anchor Drop

Marion, North Carolina: A fivefoot tall illuminated gold nugget drops into a large doughnut. The event is hosted by the Marion Rotary Club with support and sponsorship from many local organizations and businesses.

Morehead City, North Carolina: A "kids' crab pot drop" is lowered.

Mount Olive, North Carolina: The New Year's Eve Pickle is lowered down the Mt. Olive Pickle Company flagpole.



New Bern: Bear Drop

Raleigh, North Carolina: A 900-pound copper-and-steel acorn, designed by sculptor David Benson to celebrate the city's 1992 Bicentennial and Raleigh's nickname, "The City of Oaks", is lowered by a crane. The event has since become one of the busiest New Year's celebrations in the United States with roughly 40,000 attending each year and an attendance record of 80,000 set in 2012

In years when the Carolina Hurricanes play at home on New Year's Eve, PNC Arena holds its own New Year's Eve "puck drop" inside the arena for fans that attend the game.



## Get Out and Walk! 2023 is the Year of the Trail.

acked on some holiday pounds? Never fear - Brunswick County has some great walking tails and also guided walking tours if in-town is more your speed to walk off those pounds.

Brunswick Nature Park - The Coastal Land Trust purchased this large tract of land (912 acres, roughly the size of Central Park) and gave it to Brunswick County in 2004 to create a public Nature Park.

The park, located at 2601 River Road (NC 133), Winnabow, NC 28479, hosts hiking trails with a stunning view of Town Creek, biking trails, and a kayak/canoe access to Town Creek. It is open from dawn to dusk, 365 days/year.

The Brunswick Riverwalk at Belville: 580 River Road SE, Belville, NC. Discover this 1.2-mile loop trail near Leland, North Carolina. Generally considered an easy route, it takes an average of 22 min to complete. This is a popular trail for hiking and walking, but you can still enjoy some solitude during quieter times of day.

The Green Swamp Preserve - The Green Swamp contains some of the country's finest examples of longleaf pine savannas. The open savannas have a diverse herb layer with many orchids and insectivorous plants. Almost 13,000 acres of the preserve, however, are comprised of a dense evergreen shrub bog (pocosin) dominated by gallberry, titi and sweetbay.

The Green Swamp contains at least 14 different species of insectivorous plants, including extensive populations of Venus flytrap, sundew, butterworts and bladdeworts, and four species of pitcher plant. The preserve is also home to many rare animals, including the American alligator, Henslow's sparrow, Bachman's sparrow and Hessel's hairstreak butterfly.

From 17, follow HWY 211 North towards Hwy 74 for 5 miles. The parking area for the trailhead will be on the right; there is a small parking area sign just before the turn off. A kiosk at the trailhead gives you more information about the preserve.

City of Southport - The City of

Southport has partnered with the Southport Historical Society to use the free mobile app called Pocket-Sights to provide visitors and residents with directions for self-guided tours of Southport and the Cape Fear Region. Five tours are currently available.

*Historic Southport Tour* **–** 24 locations in Southport

Historic Monuments and Markers Tour - 38 locations in Southport

Safe Haven Movie Tour - 11 locations in Southport

African American Heritage Tour - 17 locations in Southport

Cape Fear River Circle Tours - 8 locations from Southport to Wilmington and return.

The first four tours are "Free Roam Tours", meaning you can either walk and/or drive from location to location in any order you choose. You will want to drive if you plan to take The Cape Fear River Circle Tour, as the "circle" covers nearly fifty miles and could take sixteen hours to walk!

The free mobile app by PocketSights will guide you from one point of interest to the next using GPS.

Download the mobile app below to take the following self-guided tours on your GPS-enabled mobile device.

Kindred Spirit Mailbox - Explore this 3.8-mile out-and-back trail near Sunset Beach, North Carolina. Generally considered an easy route, it takes an average of 1 h 5 min to complete. This is a popular trail for running and walking, but you can still enjoy some solitude during quieter times of day. The trail is open year-round and is beautiful to visit anytime.

Take NC-211 N and Hwy 17 S/ Ocean Hwy W to Sunset Blvd S in Sunset Beach. Continue on Sunset Blvd S. Drive to W Main St.

So many trails to explore and not enough space to list them all here. For more places to explore, www.alltrails.com is a great site to visit.



Valentine's day traditions around the world. This day isn't all about flowers and chocolates around the world. Different countries celebrate it in their own way.

#### Argentina – A Week of Sweetness

#### Let's Talk "Beach Bonfires"



Sitting around a low, crackling fire with your family and friends, while the sunset shimmers over the waves gently lapping against the shore ... it's a great way to spend a weekend, and one of the things Oak Island is famous for this time of year.

We're thankful this season has gone well so far, and attribute that to everyone following a few simple guidelines to ensure a safe, enjoyable bonfire experience.

However, if this is your first time hosting a bonfire, or it's been a while since you last had one, here are a few reminders to make sure your gathering starts off safely:

- 1. Bonfires should be manageable by a single person, about 4ft. x 4ft. in size or smaller (we know this size may not be "what you call a bonfire in your neck of the woods" but for the sake of discussing safety on our beaches, that is what we are referring to)
- 2. All materials burned must be natural, untreated wood (NO lumber or manufactured products, as well as gasoline, diesel, tires, or other fuels used for the burn)
- 3. Fires must be extinguished if winds exceed 15 MPH (even if the windspeed was lower when your application was submitted)

- 4. There must be a person with a means of contacting 9-1-1 at the bon-fire site at all times
- 5. There must be a way to extinguish the bonfire at all times; such as an "ABC Type II" fire extinguisher, a bucket of water, a shovel to cover the fire with sand, or other sufficient device.
- 6. All burned materials must be completely extinguished and RE-MOVED from the beach area after the burn DO NOT simply cover the fire to extinguish it, as this can still smolder and seriously injure the feet of any person or animal who walks across the burn site
- 7. No additional debris, trash, or unburned wood should be left on the beach (please remember to leave the beach cleaner than you found it)

Again, it's been a great Beach Bonfire season so far, and with your assistance, we look forward to keeping it that way throughout 2023 and beyond.
