
New Educational Displays on Kings Lynn Dr. on Oak Island

Talking Trash

id you know that the contaminant rate in Recycle Bins on Oak Island often reaches 20% or greater? Contamination adds cost and sorting time. Heavily contaminated loads may need to be taken to landfills instead of the MRF (Material Reclamation Facility). Below are important tips to create an efficient and less costly recycling practice on Oak Island and in Brunswick County.

1) Metal and aluminum cans – Empty and Rinse

Fact: Using recycled scraps to remake cans uses 95% less energy than making cans from raw materials. Aluminum can be recycled indefinitely.

2) Paper, cartons, and cardboard

- Flatten cardboard. We need to conserve space in our bins! Unfortunately, pizza boxes stained with grease or food articles need to go into the garbage dumpsters.

Fact: Cardboard is used to make new paper products in mills right here in North Carolina. That recycled paper is used to produce toilet paper, paper towels, and packaging materials.

Fact: Covid medical needs, increased at home time with more paper usage as well as the long timeline for new tree growth have resulted in a paper shortage. Grocery shelves locally have been impacted by this paper shortage.

Fact: Shredded paper cannot go into blue recycling bins. The loose paper blows out of trucks and off conveyor belts. Shredded paper will need to be bagged and placed in mainstream trash dumpster. Or look for a local Shred Event.

3) Glass bottles and jars - Empty and rinse, replace lids

Fact: Products from recycled glass produce 20% less air pollution and 50% less water pollution compared to making a new bottle from raw materials. A modern glass bottle can take 4000 years or more to decompose in a landfill.

4) Recyclable Plastics - Empty and rinse, replace caps. Only bottles, tubs, jugs, and jars. See Recycle Right! illustration below.

No plastic vegetable bags, baggies, drink cups, bubble or pillow shipping materials, plastic takeout containers, plastic coated wraps. Even if these items indicate they are recyclable, they are not currently recyclable in Brunswick County.

Fact: Plastic bagged items and plastic grocery bags are the most frequently found contaminant in recycling. Plastic bags are called "tanglers" in recycling language. They get tangled up in the gears of the machinery at the MRF (Material Reclamation Facility) and can stop the line for hours while they are cleared.

Fact: Plastic grocery bags are collected in bins outside your grocery store, please return them there, or get ahead of the game and take reusable grocery bags with you when you shop.

Fact: Plastic caps that are not reattached to the rinsed plastic container but placed in the bins loose, settle to the bottom of the bins and/or fall off the conveyer belts at the MRF. It is then necessary to collect the caps from underneath the equipment which adds to the recycling costs and time.

Fact: Styrofoam cannot go into Blue Recycling Bins. A small Styrofoam collection is found in from of most grocery stores. Better yet avoid Styrofoam cups and other Styrofoam goods as much as possible.
