Newly opened, **The Break** is complete with a surfing beach theme and has a clever menu featuring special omelettes, Belgian waffles and eggs Benedict in many varieties. Take a break and stop in for lunch and breakfast. It is located where the former **Russell's** restaurant was at 5700 E. Oak Island Dr.

Further down on Oak Island where Blue Water Point was home to the Fish house, **Lonerider Brewery**, a Raleigh based enterprise, is expected, but no date is set. You might want to check out upcoming information at **www. loneriderbeer.com**. Drop in and catch your second wind!

If you are looking for fun evenings out on Oak Island the **Grape and Ale** welcomes tasters to the Thursday night beer tastings and the Friday night wine tastings. Frequently they have live music as well. Stop in check it out and maybe join the club.

Speaking of fun nights **Second Wind**, almost across the street from

the **Grape and Ale**, rocks out! Great live bands and fine vocalists, line dancing lessons, pool and more are waiting to be sampled.

Another institution, Turtle Island changes name reverting back in time, to Back to Shuckers with the retirement of its present owners and a passing of the food torch to Willie, long time bartender and reopening soon.

Word has it that the Peruvian chicken restaurant, MMM Que Rico, 8 years in Calabash serving up authentic Peruvian and Argentinian delights is coming to the new Lowe's Plaza at the intersection of Hwy. 211 and Rte 133, as a stand-alone building. Eggs Up Grille is hurrying to open up and people are excited. Located in the suite that is the first end cap at the Lowe's Plaza you can expect eggs galore!

As far as Calabash goes, Capt. John's Seafood House practically an institution, is becoming Angus Steak and Seafood; times do change. Oyster Rock is not only serving fresh seafood choices, but "Rocks the Dock" on the weekends with crazy live music. - can get caught up and be hurt.

 Please pick up and throw away your trash from the beach. Sea life can mistake trash for food.
- If you see a nesting turtle on the beach, please do not disturb her. Watch from a distance, do not make loud noises or shine lights on her. She will be scared away and not lay her eggs.
- Please leave the tracks left by nesting turtle undisturbed. Workers use the tracks to find mark the nests for their protection,



ets are welcome at all of NC's Brunswick Islands' beaches. In fact, tripswithpets.com named Caswell Beach and Oak Island numbers 1 and 2 respectively in its list of "Top 5 Dog-Friendly Beaches in North Carolina."

Please be aware of any local leash laws or town ordinances listed below that may apply for specific beach locations. Also, please be respectful of others and clean up after your pet.

Bald Head Island - Pets on the beach must be leashed from sunset to sunrise during turtle season, May 1 through November 15. All other times, pets are permitted off leash but must remain under direct supervision at all times.

Caswell Beach - Dogs that are leashed are permitted year round on the beach strand, as long as they do not pose a threat or nuisance to others. Dogs not leashed, but under the control of their owner, are permitted on the beach strand from dawn until 9:00 am year-round. Additionally, from October 15 through March 15, dogs not leashed, but under the

control of their owner, are permitted on the beach strand all day

Holden Beach - Holden Beach does not allow dogs on the beach from May 20th to September 10th between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Dogs must be on a leash at all times on the island.

Oak Island - Dogs that are leashed are permitted year round

on Oak Island beaches. Dogs are allowed off their leash from October 15 until March 15 from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. in locations marked by beach access signs.

Ocean Isle Beach - Dogs are not permitted on the beach strand between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. during the period of Memorial Day through Labor Day. Dogs must be on a leash at all times on the island when off the premises



of the owner, keeper. or guardian.

Sunset Beach - From the Friday preceding Memorial Day through Labor Day, dogs are not allowed on the beach between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. After 6:00 p.m. and before 8:00 a.m., dogs are allowed on a leash no longer than 10 feet. After Labor Day and before the Friday preceding Memorial Day, dogs are allowed all day but must be leashed.

Paid Parking Comes to Holden Beach

aid parking will be implemented beginning May 1st on Holden Beach. Paid parking will be effective 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Parking rates for a single vehicle in all designated parking areas will be:

\$3 per hour for up to four hours

\$15 per day for durations over four hours

\$60 per week for seven consecutive days

Annual permits for the calendar year are now available and allow vehicles (this includes low-speed vehicles and trailers) access to designated parking. Permits are \$125 for a single vehicle and \$250 for two vehicles. Passes can be purchased via app, website or by phone.

Where to Park

Per ordinance, there is no parking on the streets or rights-of-way except in designated parking spaces identified by Pay-to-Park signs. The table with authorized parking can be viewed below.

How to Pay to Park

Payments will be made with Surf

CAST by Otto Connect Mobile Solution. This is a mobile app downloadable for Apple and Android devices. Download the app today. Users will setup their account, enter their license plate details and pay for parking directly on the app. Alternatively, users can scan the QR Code located on the parking signs to access a secure website.

The Otto Connect customer service team will be available to help via phone and email.

Payment Methods

Parking rates can be paid via credit/debit card or PayPal. This can be done via the mobile app, website or via phone (credit/debit only).

The easiest way to pay is via the mobile app with a one-time setup, easy pay selection of your parking zone and confirmation of your license plate each time you visit the beach. The app will also notify you 15 minutes before your permit expires and allow you to add more time to your permit without having to visit the parking lot.



May is National Skin Cancer Awareness Month

in 5 American's will develop skin cancer by the age of 70. More than 2 million people die of skin cancer in the U.S. every hour. Having more than 5 sunburns doubles your risk for melanoma. When detected early, the 5 year survival rate for melanoma is 99 percent.

Melanoma is the most serious type of a skin cancer. It begins in our melanin- the pigment that gives your skin its color. Cancer starts when cells in the body begin to grow out of control. A quarter of melanomas develop from moles. If they start to increase in size, develop irregular edges, change in color and/or start to itch, contact your doctor. A yearly skin check is recommended.

Always pay attention to changes in your skin. If you have a family history of skin cancers, prevention is key to get checked out.

Not all sunscreen/sunblocks are created the same so be aware. The most worrisome ingredient is oxvbenzone. This ingredient is commonly used & has been linked to endocrine disruption, organ system toxicity. Other harmful chemicals to be aware of are octinoxate, homosalate to name a few. Some states have outlawed sunscreen labels that carry these ingredients due to coral reef destruction. Chemical sunscreens act as sponges and absorb into the blood stream. Using physical sunscreens is the way to go. It refracts the sun rays and works like a shield.

"I can't stress enough that skin cancer no knows age" says Tharp. "We are exposed to harmful rays 365 days a year and sunscreen is a must everyday for everyone"!

- 1. Apply sunblock every 2-4 hours.
- 2. Apply your sunscreen 20-30 minutes prior to heading out.
- 3. Seek shade
- 4. Use protective SPF wear. Did you know a t-shirt only has a SPF of around 3? Just because it's a clothing it doesn't safeguard against the strong rays. SPF wear can be found easily in our local stores or on line.
- 5. Protect your eyes.
- 6. Wear a hat that covers your head and ears.
- 7. Be aware of sun sensitive medications.
- 8. Spot check moles and freckles.
- 9. Avoid the sun during peak hours generally between 10 am and 4 pm.
- 10. If you want a tan, use self tanning lotions.


