he history of Southport's Fourth of July Festival celebration was first recorded in a newspaper in 1795. When ships lying at anchor in the harbor would discharge salutes from their cannons at daybreak and throughout the day, with the ships officers and town officials sharing companionship toasting the young nations independence. In 1972 we were incorporated as the N.C. 4th of July Festival.

Here are a few new things happening here for all to try.



ollow these guidelines to protect our sea turtles and give them the best chance at survival.

During Nesting Season

Minimize beachfront lighting during the sea turtle nesting season by turning off, shielding, or redirecting lights away from the beach.

Close blinds and draperies in oceanfront rooms at night to keep indoor lighting from reaching the beach.

Fill in holes, moats or any crevice that could trap a nesting female or hatchling.

Remove recreational equipment, such as lounge chairs, umbrellas, kayaks, surfboards and boats, from the beach at night. These items can deter nesting attempts and prevent hatchlings from reaching the ocean.

Do not construct beach campfires during the nesting season. Nesting sea turtles and hatchlings are attracted to the light and may crawl into fires and death can occur.

Use your natural vision and moonlight when walking on the beach at night.

If you encounter a turtle on the beach at night, remain quiet, still, and at a distance. Please do not disturb. Lights, flash photography, and human disturbances may prevent her from nesting successfully. Please contact your local Turtle Protection group immediately.

Leave the tracks left by turtles undisturbed. The Patrol Team use the tracks to identify the species of turtle that nested and to find and mark the nests for protection.

All Year Long

Properly dispose of your garbage.

Turtles may mistake plastic bags, styrofoam, and trash floating in the water as a food source and death can occur when this trash blocks their intestines.

Celebrate events without the use of helium balloon releases. Balloons end up in the ocean, especially when released near the coast. Sea turtles can mistake the balloons as a food source which can harm them or even cause death.

Avoid trampling beach vegetation. Use beach accesses and please stay off of the dunes. Natural vegetation stabilizes sand and reduces beach erosion.

When boating, stay alert and avoid sea turtles. Propeller and collision impacts from boats and ships can result in injury and death of sea turtles. Also, stay in channels and avoid running in seagrass beds to protect this important habitat from prop scarring and damage.

Avoid anchoring boats in seagrass beds and coral reefs which serve as important feeding and resting habitats for sea turtles.







Oak Island Paid Parking is Here

he Town of Oak Island currently provides more than 1,250 parking spaces across 65 public Beach Access Locations, more than any other island community in the Carolinas! To help with the improvement and future maintenance of these spaces, as well as to reduce congestion from unregulated Rightof-Way (ROW) parking, the Town Council voted in January 2023 to initiate a Paid Parking program that would be enforced throughout the busier spring and summer months. This program is managed by the contracted vendor, Otto Connect through their proprietary SurfCAST application.

Town of Oak Island began enforcement on April 1 for the first season of the Town's new Paid Parking program. Full details on the program, including payment options, permit descriptions, citation fines, parking maps, and frequently asked questions (FAQ) are available on the Parking Information page of the Town Website at www.OakIsland-NC.gov/PARKING.

The Paid Parking Program:

Will be enforced from April 1 – September 30, between the hours of 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM (all other dates and times will not be charged)

Will provide Parking Permits in increments of \$5 / Hour • \$20 / Day • \$80 Week, which become active immediately upon purchase (NOTE: the limited number of available Seasonal Permits have already been sold for the 2023 season)

Has the following purchase options for Parking Permits:

ON SITE: Scan the QR code on the "Pay To Park" signs or visit surf-cast.ottoconnect.us/pay

MOBILE: Download the Surf-CAST mobile app, and follow the prompts provided

BY PHONE: Call the Otto Connect team at 910-200-1497

Will apply to all marked parking spaces in the beachfront areas south of the Davis Canal (WEST of SE 40th St) and E Oak Island Drive (EAST of SE 40th St)

Does not allow for parking in



spaces marked with "Town Parking" signage (for more information, click on the "Town Parking Permit" tab at www.OakIslandNC.gov/PARKING)

Restricts parking in any spaces not marked by a parking bumper or any Right-Of-Way areas in the Paid Parking Zone during the enforcement times (REMEMBER: NO BUMPER = NO PARKING)

When & Where Parking will Not be Charged:

During any time not specifically listed in the enforcement season of April 1 - September 30, between 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM

For any vehicles parked in handicap spaces, which have an appropriate license plate, placard, or hangtag (NOTE: vehicles in marked Paid or Town parking spaces will still require a Paid or Town Parking Permit)

In the immediate area surrounding Town sponsored or approved events, for the duration of the event, such as the Farmers' & Artisans' Market in the Middleton Park Complex

For residents and property owners whose vehicles have been registered with a Town Parking Permit (for more information, click on the "Town Parking Permit" tab at www.DakIslandNC.gov/PARKING)



Dosher Hospital Foundation Receives \$35,000 from The Noren Foundation

Foundation has been awarded \$35,000 in grant funding from the Noren Foundation, which is a private foundation. The funds are designated for a Cardiology Department upgrade. Included in the upgrade will be the purchase of an Electrocardiograph (EKG) machine and a RAPIDpoint Blood Gas System machine. Through the generosity of the Noren Foundation, Dosher Memorial Hospital Foundation has received \$310,000 in grant funding over the past nine years.

The purchase of a new wireless EKG machine will replace the current machine, which is 10 years old. The Cardiology Department does an average of 290 EKG's per month and with the new machine they will have wireless module capability which means there is no need to take the EKG machine in the room with the wireless module. Staff can connect the patient and run the tracing from the module. EKG's are an important tool diagnosing heart attacks or life-threatening heart rhythms.

The purchase of the RAPIDpoint Blood Gas System will allow for quick turn-around for patient results for the critical patient and allow more time to focus on patient care and less time acquiring results. The patients who need blood gas testing are patients who have shortness of breath, chronic lung disease, congestive heart failure, covid pneumonia, trauma, diabetics in a critical state and many other illnesses. The quicker the results, the quicker decisions can be made to treat the patients.

Lynda Stanley, President and CEO of Dosher, said, "The generous grant funding from the Noren Foundation has had a positive impact on our ability to respond to the needs of our patients using the most advanced equipment and technology. We are extremely grateful for their support."

Antonette (Toni) McAndrews added, "The Dosher Foundation

deeply appreciates the Noren Foundation's support over the past nine years. Through their continued support, Dosher Memorial Hospital can continue providing the very best in healthcare to the patients in our service area."






Well, it was impossible, actually. The rankings of their last three choices for the top 12 winners had





Brunswick County Sees First Increase in Homes Sold in 2023 Market Characterized by Strong Demand, Low Supply

emand remained strong in Brunswick County's residential real estate market during March, with total sales volume and the number of homes sold increasing for the first time this year. Meanwhile, new listings were down and the market netted almost no new inventory.

"Home sales are picking up again as we shake off the winter cobwebs," said Cynthia Walsh, BCAR CEO. "Demand for new homes typically increases as we move into Spring, and our market saw 3% more homes sold in March compared to 2022. This increase may seem small compared to 2021's record-breaking numbers, but the number of homes sold in March 2023 was 21% higher than 2020, 20% higher than 2019, and 16% higher than 2018. With strong demand remaining and low inventory, our market is positioned to remain highly competitive as we move into Summer."

Brunswick County \$237,490,000 in total sales volume in March, an 8% increase from last year's \$219,840,000. The average sales price increased 2.8%, from \$432,764 to \$445,038. New listings were down 2.6%, from 615 to 599, while the number of units sold increased 3%, from 508 to 523. Homes spent an average of 55 days on the market. The absorption rate, which is the amount of time it would take to sell all available inventory, held steady at 2.5 months, which is still in seller's market territory. Sellers received 97% of the original list price on average. Brunswick County's luxury market remains strong with 25 sales in excess of \$1 million, the largest coming in at \$2.6 million on Holden Beach.

Year-to-date sales volume through March totaled \$500,790,000, down 10.1% from last year's \$556,820,000. The average sales price for the year is up 0.2% from 2022, increasing from \$436,083 to \$436,794. The number of units sold through March is down 12.1%, from 1278 to 1123, and the number of new listings is up 8.3%, from 1450 to 1570.

Inflation Coming Down, but Slowly

he Consumer Price Index, the broadest measure of consumer prices, rose 6% annually in February. That is down from the peak of 9.1% in June 2022, but still very high. Inflation rose 0.4% from January to February.

Why it matters: This is a strong signal that we are not through with inflation yet.

By the numbers: Monthly data had been falling rapidly before the last few months.

Housing was the biggest driver in February. Prices for recreation, household furnishings and operations, and airline fares also rose.

Prices for used cars and trucks and for medical care decreased.

Core prices (all items less food and energy) rose 0.5% and are up 5.5% annually, which is high.






