



Staff at Dosher Memorial Hospital celebrate their 5-star rating for patient recommendation.







Starting December 1, More People can Get Health Coverage through Medicaid.

NC Medicaid will soon cover people ages 19 through 64 years with higher incomes. You may be able to get health care coverage through Medicaid even if you didn't qualify before. Medicaid pays for doctor visits, yearly checkups, emergency care, mental health and more – at little or no cost to you. Starting December 1, most people will be able to get health care cover-

age through NC Medicaid if:You live in North Carolina

- You are 19-64 years old
- You are a citizen. (Some non-US citizens can also get health care coverage through Medicaid.)
- And if your household income falls within the chart below:

Household size Total income, before taxes

Single Adults \$1,676/month or less

(\$20,120/year)

Family of 2 \$2,267/month or less

(\$27,214/year)
Family of 3 \$2,859/month or less

(\$34,307/year)

Family of 4 \$3,450/month or less

(\$41,400/year)

Each additional (add \$7,094/year)

If someone is pregnant, they may be eligible for other Medicaid programs to get full health benefits. And if you were eligible before, you still are. Nothing changes for you.

NC Medicaid covers most health services. It includes doctor visits, checkups, emergency care, hospital services, maternity and postpartum care, vision and hearing services, prescription drugs, behavioral health, preventative and wellness services, devices, and more. There's no monthly fee and copays are never more than \$4.

ALERT: Rental Listing Scam

e've had some reports of a Rental Listing Scam making its way around our county.

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), scammers take over legitimate rental listings and make them their own. Scammers copy the pictures and descriptions of online rental listings, replace the agent's contact information with their own, and post the phony ads on a new site. If you call or email about the rental you'll reach a scammer, who may take your money for an application fee, deposit, first month's rent, or vacation rental charge. Then, the scammer disappears, and you're left with no place to move in to. Many times this money is taken via mobile payment services such as Venmo, or Apple Pay.

Some scammers have even told victims the kev to the rental house is in the mail and to use a screwdriver to get into the home!

BCSO detectives are asking folks to meet with the property owner or rental agent before sending money. A scammer will never agree to a meeting which is an indication the listing is fake.



45th Annual U.S. Open King Mackerel Tournament Awards Almost \$400,000 in Prizes

he record-setting 45rd Annual U.S. Open King Mackerel Tournament was held Oct. 5-7 at Dutchman Creek Park. It attracted 558 boats, missing the highest number of participants in the tournament's history by three boats set in 2021. Total purse was over \$390,000.

With their single-engine vessel, Tripple J, Captain Joe Matthews and his crew, Deanne Matthews and Joey Matthews of Winnabow, N.C. took first place in the tournament with a 43.45 lb., king mackerel. They won a total of \$92,320 for their efforts.

The second-place team, Blew By U!, led by Captain Corey Durako of Wilmington, N.C., brought in a king mackerel weighing 41.50 lbs., which won them a combined total of \$117,680.

In third place was Strictly Business, led by Captain Jeff Crouch of Oak Island, NC. Their winning fish weighed in at 38.95 lbs., which won them \$71,555.

The winners are determined by the weight of the fish, however, the total prize money is determined by the number of additional categories the anglers choose to enter in the tournament.

"Overall, the tournament was a great success and will go down in the record books as one of the biggest one we've had to date in terms of participants and prizes," said Karen Sphar, executive vice president of the Southport Oak Island Area Chamber of Commerce. "We appreciate everyone who participated in the tournament, from the anglers who fished it, to the sponsors, vendors and volunteers who helped make it happen, and of course our tournament planning committee and Board of Directors, led by Carol Magnani."

This was the fourth time the tournament was held at Dutchman Creek Park. Brunswick County Parks & Recreation officials worked with Tournament officials to ensure a family friendly and fun event was held. Rusty Hooks Dockside Grill provided a location for anglers to reboard their boats after weighing in and the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office and Oak Island Water Rescue provided marine traffic control on the water.

The U.S. Open King Mackerel Tournament is the largest king mackerel tournaments on the East Coast and has a \$2 million economic impact on the region. It is held annually the first week of October and is an event of the Southport Oak Island Area Chamber of Commerce.

a Shrimp Boil, and Shrimp & Grits made by award winning Frying Pan Restaurant Chef Craig Blanks.







right in front of the shop. In fact, it has become a favorite place to have your photo snapped. Stop by and check it out.


