

s of Thursday, November 16, 2023 after the official end of Sea Turtle Nesting Season, Beach Bonfires are once again permitted on the public beach areas. While enjoying bonfires on the beach is a time-honored tradition for many, there are some important tips everyone needs to know, whether it's their first-ever fire or just the first for the season.

Permits

A Beach Bonfire Permit is RE-QUIRED from the Fire Department before any bonfire can be conducted. Permits are FREE to submit online, and simply provide the Fire Department with a record of when and where to expect open flames on the public beach areas.

Permit Approval: The permit process is automated, and no direct approval response from the Fire Department is provided. After submitting, you should receive a an email copy of your Permit Application. Retain this copy, either in printed or digital form, as this may be requested by first responders if called to your areas. If you do not receive a copy, be sure to check your email "spam" or "junk" folder; you can also request help through the Fire Department Contact Form.

Beach Bonfire Permits:

CANNOT be submitted more than 72 hours from the date on the bonfire, to allow for accurate windspeed forecast

MUST use the windspeed forecast provided on the Bonfire Permit Application (no third-party apps)

CANNOT cover multiple bonfires or multiple days (one permit per bonfire, per day)

MUST be submitted directly by

the individual they will be used for others cannot do this for you as part of a free or paid service

IMPORTANT: If at any point windspeed forecasts change to exceed 15 MPH, all permits will be effectively CANCELLED until windspeeds lower. (NOTE: If windspeeds return to safe limits before your original bonfire date expires, a new application will not be needed.)

Beach Bonfire Rules

When conducting a Beach Bonfire, safety is the top priority! This applies to those hosting the bonfire, as well as neighboring properties.

Beach Bonfires:

CANNOT be placed in the Emergency Vehicle Paths or on any sand dunes / berms (stay in front of Water Safety Station signage)

MUST have a flame size about 4 feet in diameter or smaller

CANNOT burn yard debris, trash, or any materials other then dried firewood

MUST cool and completely remove all burned materials from the beach (DO NOT bury materials in the sand)

If at any point, peak windspeeds exceed 15 MPH all active bonfires must be EXTINGUISHED immediately, until windspeeds lower.

Remembering to practice fire safety, and cleaning up after your bonfire is what allows the Town to continue hosting a Beach Bonfire Season. Please do your part to help ensure this community favorite activity remains available for generations to come!


Applications are accepted December 1 through February 15. Grants are awarded in the spring.

"Normal November" For Brunswick County's Real Estate Market

n November, Brunswick County's residential real estate market told a familiar story. The number of homes sold and the prices of those homes didn't change much from November 2022, while the number of new listings increased slightly and homes continued to sell quickly.

"November's numbers are 100% on trend with what we've seen historically and throughout this year," said Cynthia Walsh, BCAR CEO. "It's normal for real estate activity to decrease during the holiday months, so it's not surprising to see the numbers line up with Novembers of the past. Overall, our market remains strong and steady as we close out the year."

Brunswick County saw new listings increase 12.3% in November, increasing from 446 to 501. Total sales volume increased 6.6%, from \$179,500,000 to \$191,360,000. The average sales price increased 7.1%, from \$453,283 to \$485,680, while the median sales price decreased 4.6%, from \$384,240 to \$366,495. The number of units sold decreased 0.5%, from 396 to 394. Brunswick County saw 27 sales of \$1 million or higher, with the largest sale at more than \$3 million in Ocean Isle Beach.

Homes spent just over a month on the market in November. The absorption rate, which is the amount of time it would take to sell all the current inventory, hovers at three months. Year-to-date sales volume through November totaled \$2,317,590,000, down 1.4% from \$2,350,690,000 at the same point in 2022. The average year-to-date sales price dipped 2.9% compared to the same point in 2022, from \$454,135 to \$440,865, while the median sales price decreased 1.2%, from \$370,514 to \$366,224. The number of units sold through November fell 4.6% compared to last year, from 5,168 to 4,930 and the number of new listings decreased 0.1%, from 6,068 to 6,062.

Oak Island Sea Turtle Protection Program Announces 2023 Season Results

here were a few obstacles but supporting our efforts! overall, a great season! 2023 was our third-highest number of nests on record! We have had record-breaking years two years in a row! This season we were #1 on the leaderboard on seaturtle.org, and we were third in NC for the number of nests per beach...Cape Hatteras and Cape Lookout beat us! We are so very blessed to be able to help protect and care for the sea turtles that visit our beautiful island! Thank you to those of you who care and continue

There were a total of 133 nests laid, the third highest number on record - with 101 false crawls. The mean clutch count was 110.5 (relocated only), with 53.8 days average incuba-

10,887 eggs hatched, with mean hatch success at 74.3% and nest success at 91.6%.

Emerged hatchings came in at 9,921, with mean emergence success at 68%, and beach success at

56.8%.

One interesting fact: Nesting Turtle #CC009318 laid 6 nests this season on Oak Island and only laid nests on Oak Island. Since 2016, she has laid a total of 15 nests - 2 on Cape Lookout and 13 on Oak Island, according to records.



Now is the Time to Care and Be Aware!

e all care about our Family, friends and neighbors. The John E. Jacobs American Legion Post #68 of Leland (www.ncpost68.com) is asking you to pay attention to those around us that we care about. This time of year those of us with depression, traumatic brain injury (TBI) and other mental health issues may be having a hard time. Post #68 Vice Commander John Hacker is leading a program called, "Veterans Suicide Awareness Community Project". We are also recognizing an often overlooked portion of our population, female

veterans. Often female veterans are not recognized for their service. This needs to change, many served side by side with their male counterparts and were exposed to the same trauma. Did you know 1 in every 6 Active Duty members, 1 in every 4 Reserve members and 1 in every 5 National Guard is a

woman. Patty Kelly stated, "I want to add another stressor and would like to hear what other female veterans think. I don't believe female veteran's military service is as valued in our society as men's service. Many of us served much longer than some men, but it isn't recognized by many. An annual review of suicide among veterans found that rates increased in 2021 during COVID-19 lockdowns, with the largest jumps among young women with some military service, according to a report released Thursday the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Among young women, when compared to their civilian counterparts who never joined the military, female veterans between 18 to 34 years old were nearly three and a half times (3½X) more likely to take their own lives in 2021, and among women of

all ages who died by suicide in 2021. Overall, the rate of female veterans of any age dying by suicide jumped by 23.7% from 2020, versus a jump 3.5% among men. Web site: Be The One www.legion.org/betheone

The VA's annual suicide report for 2023 indicates the rate of suicide among women veterans of different age groups versus women with no military ties increased. Women veterans 18 to 34 spiked to over 3.5, meaning veteran women in that age group were 3.5 times more likely to die by suicide than their civilian peers, a record high.



One report indicated a lot of the other issues might just be issues that women in the country face that are compounded for veterans. Like lack of childcare due to availability or cost, waning support systems and work-related struggles. They've had not the best experience in the military and a lot of mothers have reached out, saying, how they've been separated from their children or have been the primary caretaker as a woman in the military and then becoming a veteran and trying to find that same income. There's a lot of stressors.

It comes down to Community support and understanding these issues that our Female Veterans are faced with today.

Housing Development Approved Near Brunswick Elementary School

Brunswick County elementary school could soon see 85 new neighbors.

Despite concerns from neighbors and community members, a major subdivision project next door to Jessie Mae Monroe Elementary School was approved by the Brunswick County Planning Board this month.

Dubbed "Pea Landing," the project looks to bring 85 single-family homes to 28.76 acres of land just north of the elementary school on Pea Landing Road. The developer's application indicates all 85 lots will be three-bedroom homes.

Phil Norris of Norris and Tunstall Consulting Engineers addressed the board representing the developer. Norris said the property was previously agricultural land but it hadn't been farmed in a few years. Norris also added there are no wetlands on the property that would be threatened by the development.

Lifelong Brunswick County resident and neighboring property owner Kevin Pierce expressed concerns about added traffic, flooding, the "overdevelopment" of the south end of the county and the proposed subdivision's close proximity to the elementary school.

State Awards \$2.8m to Improve **Public Beach, Water Accesses**

than \$2.8 million to improve public accesses to beaches and

of Environmental Quality's Division of Coastal Management announced Monday the awards for fiscal 2023-24.

"This funding makes our coasts more accessible to all North Carolina residents and visitors, so everyone has the opportunity to enjoy our natural resources," NCDEQ Secretary Elizabeth S. Biser said in a statement. "We are proud to partner with local governments and communities to support projects that also benefit our coastal economy."

The Public Beach and Coastal Waterfront Access program provides matching funds to local governments in the 20 coastal counties. Governments that receive grants must match them by contributing at least 25% toward the project's cost. Funding for the grant program comes from the North Carolina General Assembly through the state's Parks and Recreation Trust Fund.

Sunset Beach received \$460,734 total to renovate the existing beach accesses at 29th, 34th and 37th streets.

Holden Beach received \$420,000 for development of Block Q. This project will create new restrooms and parking for beach access, a boat ramp, and public entertainment area. The project also includes landscaping and stormwater improvements.

Carolina Beach received \$600,000 for the acquisition of three adjacent parcels on Canal Drive on the north end of town to provide parking and access to the beach and Freeman

Kure Beach received \$71,025 to replace the existing 8-foot wide, 134foot long wooden walkway with a 10-foot wide Americans with Disabilities Act-accessible walkway to the beach at Public Beach Access No. 140, and \$62,700 to replace the existing 8-foot-wide 97-foot long wooden

coastal communities walkway with a 10-foot wide, Amerhave been awarded more icans With Disabilities Act-compliant walkway to the beach to Public Beach Access No. 99.

Nags Head received \$89,313 for The North Carolina Department improvements to the Governor Street Public Beach Access. Improvements include a new ADA-compliant elevated dune crossover with associative ADA-compliant parking stalls, and a shower station up-fit.

> Washington received \$800,000 to complete renovations to the 1,981foot boardwalk along the Washington Wetlands Boardwalk.

> Hyde County received \$108,900 to complete boardwalk renovations at Far Creek Boardwalk along Far Creek in Englehard.

Surf City received \$10,875 for updates to the Broadway Street Access Site. This project will update the existing public restrooms and outdoor showers to meet federal accessibility standards, pave dedicated handicapped accessible parking spaces and walkways to the restrooms and beach accessway.

Winton received \$189,325 for improvements to the Winton Town Park. Improvements include construction of a new fishing pier with boat slips; replacement of the decking on the existing boardwalk; renovation of the restrooms to meet federal accessibility specifications; paving of dedicated handicapped accessible parking spaces and walkways to the restrooms and water accessway; and the addition of riprap to shoreline to secure the eroding shoreline.

The program has awarded 497 grants totaling more than \$53.8 million to improve public waterfront access sites since it began in 1981. For more information about the program, go to the Public Beach and Coastal Waterfront Access website.

Access projects may include walkways, dune crossovers, restrooms, parking areas, piers and related projects. Funds also may be used for land acquisition or urban waterfront revitalization. Division of Coastal Management staff selected the recipients based on criteria set by the Coastal Resources Commission.




