

Day 5: Faithful for a Thousand Generations

Devotional

By the end of a week like this one, it helps to step back and see the full picture. We have looked at who Jesus truly is, what it means to make Him Lord, how His promises do not expire, and how His mercy reaches the people who feel most disqualified.

All of it points to one foundational truth. You can trust this God.

He is not a God who started strong and faded. He is the same One who parted the Red Sea, who kept His covenant with Abraham, who raised Jesus from the dead, and who poured out His Spirit at Pentecost. That same power and that same faithfulness are not historical footnotes. They are present realities.

His blessings extend to a thousand generations because the I Am never loses track. He was, He is, and He is to come. That means the story He is writing in your life is not finished. The chapter you are in right now is not the last one.

Do not count out His faithfulness. Not over your family, not over your circumstances, not over your future. He has been faithful before, and He will be faithful again. You can trust a God like that.
