

Day 3: God Has Not Forgotten You

Devotional

Three years is a long time to wait. Three years of famine. Three years of silence from the rest of the world. Three years of the same routine, trusting that God had not forgotten the promise He made.

If you are in a waiting season right now, you know how heavy that can feel. The longer the wait, the louder the doubt gets. Maybe you have started to wonder if God has moved on, if your situation is just too far gone, or if the miracle you believed for was never really coming.

Here is what you need to hear today: God has not forgotten you. Not for a single moment. His mercies are not running low. They are new every morning, and that means tomorrow holds just as much of His faithfulness as yesterday did.

Your adversary wants you to stumble in the middle of your waiting. He wants you to give up just before the breakthrough. But the middle time is not the end of the story. Elijah waited three years, and it only took one moment to shake a nation.

Your moment is still coming. Hold on. Keep believing. He is faithful, and He has not let go of you.
