

Day 3: God Has No Expiration Date

Devotional

We live in a world that is obsessed with timing. Deadlines, countdowns, and expiration dates shape almost every part of our lives. It is natural, then, to start applying that same thinking to God and His promises.

Maybe you prayed for something years ago and nothing seemed to happen. Maybe a situation in your family has dragged on so long that hope feels naive. It is tempting to quietly conclude that the window has closed.

But the I Am does not operate on a human timeline. When God spoke His name to Moses at the burning bush, He was not just giving a title. He was revealing His nature. He is not the God who was. He is the God who is, always present, always active, never running out of time.

Here is what that means for you practically. The promise He spoke over your life was not bound to a specific calendar year. He who made the promise was already standing in your future when He made it. He has not forgotten, and He has not moved on. His faithfulness does not have an expiration date, and neither does your hope.
