

## Day 3: More Than Just Knowing His Name

### Devotional

There is a difference between knowing about someone and actually knowing them. You can know facts about a person, follow them online, and still be a complete stranger to who they really are.

The same is true with Jesus.

Confessing Him as Lord is a powerful and necessary step. It is the door. But Jesus invites you to walk through that door and keep going. He wants you to learn from Him, not just learn about Him.

In Acts 17, the believers in Berea were called noble, not because they witnessed the most miracles, but because they took the time to search the Scriptures daily. They were not content with secondhand faith. They wanted to know for themselves.

That kind of intentional pursuit changes you. When you spend time in His Word, when you sit with what He actually said and how He actually lived, something shifts. You begin to think differently, respond differently, and want differently.

Transformation does not happen by accident. It happens when you make a daily decision to learn from the One who knows you best and loves you most.

You do not need a theology degree. You just need a willing heart and a little time. Start there.
