

Day 4: Don't Let Doubt Fill the Room

Devotional

Doubt does not usually arrive all at once. It creeps in slowly, quietly, the way leaven works through dough. A disappointment here. An unanswered prayer there. A moment where you believed and nothing seemed to happen. Over time, if those moments go unchecked, they can fill your entire outlook.

This is one of the enemy's most effective strategies. He does not need to destroy your faith outright. He just needs to discourage it enough that you stop using it.

But here is the truth: disappointment does not have to have the final word. Peter failed in Matthew 17, unable to help a boy in desperate need. Yet he kept showing up, kept believing, kept growing. By Acts 2, that same Peter stood before thousands and preached a message that changed lives forever.

Your past moments of doubt do not disqualify you. They are simply part of the journey. Choose today to lean into the faith God has given you rather than the discouragement the enemy has tried to plant.
